WMAG provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Advances made in fighting cystic Fibrosis: Rebecca Bobbit is the mother of Caroline. Her disease was not diagnosed until she was 16 years of age. Rebecca was able to talk about how diagnosis and treatment has changed and advanced in the years since her daughter was born and since she was first discovered to have Cystic Fibrosis in 2008.
- Availability of fresh fruit in Guilford County: John Ivey is a farm agent in Guilford County. He told us about the large number of fresh strawberries avaiable in guilford county from the local farms. Buying and picking fresh strawberries from local farms helps the local economy and helps to provide a source of good fresh food for the population. John talked about the different varieties of strawberries available in guilford county and the way they can used and preserved for use later in the year.
- Cystic Fibrosis: Mark Hanson father of Annabelle, a child with Cystic Fibrosis. Mark talks about how his 4 year old child lives and functions with cystic fibrosis, which was discovered when she was just a month old. They raise money thorough an organization called the Belle Raisers. No governmennt dollars are used for research in finding a cure. We discussed how cystic fibrosis affects the lives of the children and adults who have this genetic disease.
- Eating and preparing good meals on a tight budget: Arnicia Gudger is nutrition specilist for North Carolina and teaches parents how to better buy food and prepare food for their families while on a strict budget. Buying locally grown foods can be cheaper and offers more nutrition.
- Financial & Local Health Impact of farming: The farm agent with the North Carolina Cooperative Extension service in Guilford County talked about the Financial and health impact farming has on Guilford County. Buying produce from local farms mean you are keeping your money right here among the local citizens such as yourself. You are also able to provide your family with fresh food that is better for you and more easily prepared and stored.
- Keeping NC roads and Highway Litter Free: Sgt Mike Baker with the NC Highway Patrol talked about the ways that law enforcement is working to

prevent littering in North Carolina. Sgt Baker told how citizens can notify law enforcment officials if they see someone littering. He also talked about the dangers of littering and how it can cause accidents on our roadways. He urges everyone to avoid littering and to report it if you see it..

- Learning camps for urban youth-feeding hungry kids: Peggy Lewis Joyce runs the learning camps for youth in Guilford County as part of the 4-H programs provided by the North Carolina Cooperative extension Service in Guilford County. The camps offer local young people the chance to spend some of their summer days being taught how to create robots, rockets or learn to be forensic scientests. Most of the camps are day camps but they also offer a couple of overnight weeklong camps for youth. They are also helping to raise money to feed hungry kids in the summer.
- Local Farmers and Strawberry Farms: John Ivey talked about where local residents can go to pick their own strawberries and help to keep local farmers in business. Local fruits and vegetables are also a great source of healthy food.
