- Alzheimer's walk and Association: Kim and Shari talked about the advances being made to combat Alzheimers. Shari discussed living with Alzheimers after her father was diagnosed. They also talked about the upcoming fund raising wall and the support groups for families living with Alzheimers.

- Childhood Cancer: Michelle Manriquez Founder And Director Of Mandies Miles and Christy Hayes, Board Member. Mandie (tm)s Miles is a Nonprofit created by Michelle Manriquez in honor of her daughter Mandie. She passed away June 7th 2018 with brain cancer while she was a senior in High School. Mandie's Miles is an advocate for the Brenner Children (tm)s Pediatric Brain Tumor Program, the region (tm)s only dedicated program, offering experts devoted to treating children and adolescents with brain and spinal cord tumors, a patient-centered and collaborative approach, access to the latest treatments, and cuttingedge research. With great determination and collaboration, we as a community, can create awareness for children, along with their families, in finding knowledge, strength, and hope. Passionate to a cause that may not soon disappear, we are taking Mandie's dreams and

- **Community and School Gardens:** Community Gardens seek to bring together people in the community to grow fruits, vegetables, flowers and herbs on common ground. A school garden is an outdoor classroom: a living laboratory where garderns of all ages learn by observing and doing. There are currently over 140 community gardens in Guilford County.
- Entreprenaurship and Share The Harvest: Miller Browning is a teen age entreprenaur who raises money for charitable organizations by selling items he creates on his website. Quina Weber-Shirk tells us about a program to distribute food called Share The Harvest
- Greensboro Pride Festival: Kayt Stewart of Alternative Resources of The Triad is the co-chair of the Greensboro Pride Festival to be held 9/15/2019 in downtown Greensboro. Kayt tells us what we can expect at this years festival and how there is still time for vendors to sign up to be part of the festival.
- Heart Disease: Jennifer tells us about the origin and mission of the American Hear Assolation and some of the strides made in heart health due to the research dollars raised by the AHA. She also talks about some the events through out the year for the heart association
- Helping Youth and Military Vets: PGA REACH is the charitable 501(c)(3) arm of the PGA of America. The program has been instilled in each of the 41 sections, to continue the impact at a section level. The Carolinas PGA is the largest of the 41 sections and had our own Foundation, PGA REACH Carolinas. Mirroring national, PGA REACH Carolinas has three pillars of focus: youth, military, and diversity & inclusion.

- Job Training and Placement: Sarah Lanse, Marketing Specialist with Goodwill Industries of Central North Carolina talks about the mission of Triad Goodwill and they help people with job training and placement
- Local Foods Week: Local Foods week is a special program in Guilford county which showcases all of the opportunities to buy and find foods which are grown and raised locally. Buying your food which is sourced locally means you have fresher and more nutritious food plus you help to keep your money here in the local community helping local farmers.
- Lupus and support groups: Ally Hunter talks about Lupus. What it is and what kind of treatments are available. We also discuss the Lupus Foundation of America and what kind of services are available for persons with Lupus and their family members including support groups in the Triad area.
- Military Veterans: Operation North State (ONS) is a 501 c3 non-profit (ALL VOLUNTEER) organization which currently offers eighteen (38)

unique military support services programs for North Carolina's deployed troops and veterans-in-need. - **Providing jobs for former inmates**: Brian Hamilton and Inmates to Entrepreneurs - Our mission: To assist formerly incarcerated individuals in starting their own business and engaging in entrepreneurship by providing resources, mentorship and hope. Our vision: To reduce the rate of recidivism by providing an alternative path to financial stability and success.
- Public Health and Immunization: Dr. Iulia Vann, MD, MPH Assistant Health Director and Vonda Pabon, RN Clinical Nurse Manager. Measles and vaccinations is the topic. Our guests are from the Guilford County Department of Public Health and we talk about the resurgence of measles in the US and the safety of vaccines.
