WMKS Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WMKS provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- 250 Mile Hike to end hunger: Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest NC Chuck Harmon will set off on a 250-mile long Hike to End Summer Hunger. It (tm)s a huge commitment, but Harmon is ready. He has been training for weeks at walk events hosted by school groups, apartment communities, local businesses and others. Along the way, Harmon has collected thousands of pounds of food and thousands of dollars to support Second Harvest Food Bank and its partners working to fill the summer meal gap for kids
- **4H Programs**: 4H programs for Spring and Summer. Camps that are available for young people to attend. There are over 54,000 school age youth in Guilford County. Youth in Guilford County need opportunities that will help them grow into responsible citizens. Family, schools and community all play a role in providing those opportunities. The Guilford County 4-H program can provide learning experiences which positively impact the lives of children.
- ACS Cancer Programs: Tracey Smith of American Cancer Society. What is the history of the american cancer society? How did it get started? How do you raise money? What are the funds used for? What are some of the advancements in cancer cures?
- Body cams and local law enforcement: Local Law Enforcement Body Cameras on officers. How soon will all officers have the body cams. What is the procedure for their operation? How will requests for the video be handled for the public?
- Childhood Hunger: One in 4 children living in Northwest North Carolina lives with uncertainty over whether they will have enough to eat. (Source: Feeding America's Map the Meal Gap study) In collaboration with our partner food assistance programs, schools, funding partners and others, Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest NC works to address this problem through a number of special programs.
- Feeding America: Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest NC is a proud member of Feeding America, the nation's largest domestic hunger-relief charity comprised of more than 200 member food banks. Together, we provide critical food assistance to more than 46 million Americans each year - or 1 in 7 Americans - including 12 million children and 7

million seniors.

- Filling up local food bank: 2nd Harvest Food Bank Local Food Bank fundraising. Since the economic downturn, Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest NC has seen the number of people coming to our partner agencies grow from 135,000 people to nearly 300,000 people. One-third of those we are helping are children. Many who are now seeking food assistance never imagined they'd have to turn for help to feed their families.
- Food Insecurity: 2nd Harvest Food Bank 24.1% of children living in Northwest NC are food insecure (1 in every 4 children). Nationwide, 1 in every 5 children lives in a food insecure household. Map the Meal Gap also reveals that 24% of people who are food insecure in our region are ineligible for Food and Nutrition Services (formerly Food Stamps), while 25% of food insecure children live in households with incomes that make them ineligible for federal child nutrition programs. For these families in particular, Second Harvest Food Banks and our network of partner programs offer a critical source of nutritional support.
- Food programs : EFNAP Food Program. How to buy store and prepare healthy and nutritious food for your family.
- Grants for summer food programs: Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest North Carolina is the recipient of two grants that will have a big impact in the lives of Caswell County families struggling with food insecurity, plus provide a boost for local farmers. The grants are independent, yet will work in tandem to support the families and children turning to County Outreach Ministry in Yanceyville for nutritional support. A \$9,150 grant from the Community Foundation of the Dan River Region will allow the Ministry to expand its summer meal program for children to five days a week for up to 125 children. It also provides a commercial grade refrigerator and freezer for perishable items and underwrites a Cooking Matters course, in which Second Harvest nutrition educators teach participants how to cook healthy meals with a limited budget. A \$12,000 grant from The Conservation Fund (tm)s Resourceful Communities Program and the Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust will support local farmers, allowing the Ministry to purchase fresh, sustainably-grown produce at market rate, and will provide funding for several additional cooking and canning classes.
- History of the American Cancer Society: Tracey Smith of American Cancer Society. What is the history of the american cancer society? How did it get started? How do you raise money? What are the funds used for? What are some of the advancements in cancer cures?
