
WKXA News Director Matt Demczyk has noted the following as significant issues during the October 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 time period:

Subject: Murderer sentenced

News Broadcasts: 10/31

The sentencing hearing was held in Hancock County Common Pleas Court for a man found guilty last week of murdering a police drug informant in Findlay. Eric A Reed, 50, of Fort Worth, Texas, was convicted of aggravated murder and two counts of having weapons while under disability. Authorities say Reed shot and killed Brian McQuiston in 2017 as retaliation after McQuiston gave police information resulting in drug charges against Reed's nephew.

Subject: School bus involved in crash

A Findlay City Schools bus was involved in a crash on Friday night. The crash, between the bus and a pickup truck, occurred in the area of Interstate 75 and Trenton Avenue in Findlay. The school bus ended up in the southbound lanes of I-75 pointing northbound. The front of the bus appeared to have sustained significant damage. Findlay City Schools said all students who were on the bus are safe. The crash is under investigation by the Ohio State Highway Patrol.

Subject: Hospital bomb threat

The Findlay Police Department says Blanchard Valley Hospital in Findlay received a bomb threat on Tuesday. Police say the threat was emailed to the hospital and stated that explosives were in the building. The Hancock County Sheriff's Office, Findlay Police Department and Fire Department, and hospital security team were on scene. Police say personnel searched the interior and exterior of the hospital grounds and a bomb detection K9 unit arrived on scene to assist in the search.

The Findlay Police Department says it was contacted by Findlay City Schools security on Sunday that several school administrators received an email containing threats. The police department says multiple Ohio school districts, including Findlay City Schools, received emailed threats on Sunday. Findlay City Schools immediately reported the threats to the Findlay Police Department. The police department says state and federal law enforcement have investigated, and according to assessments from the Ohio Homeland Security/Terrorism Analysis Unit and the Statewide Terrorism Analysis & Crime Center, the emails appear to be part of a swatting campaign or hoaxes, with no credible threat detected.

Subject: Driver in Pond Identified

In November, Moore, pleaded guilty to two counts of felonious assault, a second-degree felony, in connection with the April 8th shooting at a building on East Front Street that wounded two men.
