1. 10 finalists, 1 competition. Who will become the next Voice for Habitat?: (January 3, 2024, 8:30am) Ten stellar finalists vying for the title of A Voice for Habitat will take the stage at Tarleton State University ballrooms on Saturday, Jan. 13. Stacy Morrison, president of Erath County Habitat for Humanity, told Beneath the Surface News that not only are this year's finalists full of talent, they are full of heart.
2. Pickers & Poets kicks off new series this Sunday with performance by Courtney Patton: (January 8, 2024, 8:30am) The new season of Pickers & Poets kicks off with a performance by Courtney Patton from 4-6:30 p.m. Sunday, Jan. 14, in the Chapel on the Bosque on the grounds of the Stephenville Historical House Museum. There is no cover charge, but there will be free snacks and refreshments, including craft beer provided by the Thirsty Armadillos.
3. 4th annual Better Beginnings Brunch moving to Tarleton ballroom. Tickets, sponsorships still available: (January 10, 2024, 8:30am) Cross Timbers Family Services is hosting its fourth annual Better Beginnings Brunch from 10 a.m. – 1 p.m. on Saturday, Jan. 27, at the Thompson Center Ballroom at Tarleton State University. Proceeds from the event benefit CTFS, which assists victims of violent crime. The brunch will include mimosas, a photo booth, silent auction, shopping and guest speakers.
4. Tarleton breaks ground on \$80 million Health Professions Building: (January 17, 2024, 8:30am) Tarleton State broke ground Wednesday on an \$80 million Health Professions Building that will further establish the university as the leader of rural healthcare throughout the state. The project was approved by The Texas A&M System Board of Regents last November, with move-in planned for summer 2025. Three new degree programs are set to be added in conjunction with the new facility, including physical therapy, occupational therapy and physician assistant studies.
5. Mayor Doug Svien files for re-election: 'There's never been a better time to live in Stephenville.': (January 22, 2024, 8:30am) Stephenville Mayor Doug Svien is ready to serve another term. He wasted no time filing for May's re-election, saying "It's been my privilege to serve Stephenville as mayor over the past 5 1/2 years. I look forward to another two years of working with our citizens, city council, county commissioners, SISD, TSU and SEDA for continued quality growth for our city.

1. Helping Stephenville sparkle and shine for more than 80 years; Swindle's Jewelry recognized as 'Texas Treasure: (February 1, 2024, 8:30am) Swindle's Jewelry has been designated as a Texas Treasure Business by the Texas Historical Commission. Founded in 1942 by Grady and Gracie Swindle in Dublin, Swindle's Jewelry continues to be a family-owned and operated business. During WWII, Grady and Gracie founded a watchmaking school in the back of their store in Dublin to provide disabled veterans returning home from war an opportunity to learn the trade.
2. Registration underway for Pinecone Dash, a 5K, 10K and 1-mile fun benefiting Ranger College's EMS students: (February 6, 2024, 8:30am) The Pinecone Dash Foundation and Ranger College's EMS program are partnering to host the second annual Pinecone Dash on Saturday, April 6, at the Bosque River Trail in Stephenville. Interstate Inn, Stephenville's new boutique hotel, and the Seeker restaurant set to open this summer: (February 9, 2024, 8:30am) Building on Texas' current motel renaissance, Mod Motels is a new venture converting cherished roadside motels into modern destinations. The Dallas-based company is led by siblings Lisa Lennox, Cathy Bonner and Kirk Bonner. Mod Motels' inaugural project, the 33-room Interstate Inn, is set to make its debut in Stephenville, Texas this summer.
4. Candidate forum to give voters chance to meet those running for Erath County commissioner, tax assessor: (February 12, 2024, 8:30am) Voters will get the chance to hear from candidates running for county commissioner and tax assessor when the Erath County Republican Party hosts a forum on Thursday, Feb. 15, at City Hall at City Limits in Stephenville. A meet-and-greet will begin at 6 p.m. then candidates will begin introducing themselves at 7. The Primary Election is March 5. Early voting begins Feb. 20.
5. Election 2024: Candidates in race for Erath County tax assessor, commissioner face May runoff: (March 5, 2024, 8:30am) A runoff is in the works in Erath County after candidates in the race for tax assessor and commissioner of precinct 3 failed to clinch the Republican nomination Tuesday by getting 51 percent of the vote. Valerie Stephen with 1,956 votes (36.11%) and Niki McInroe-Cogburn with 1,426 votes (26.32%) will face-off in the runoff for tax assessor on Tuesday, May 28.
2. Top Stephenville ISD students earn automatic admission into Tarleton with renewed pact: (March 10, 2024, 8:30am) Stephenville Independent School District seniors in the top 50 percent of their graduating class will continue to earn automatic admission to Tarleton State University, thanks to a three-year renewal of the district's Distinguished High School Partners pact. The President's Guaranteed Scholarship Program assures first-time-in-college students graduating in the top half of their high school class between \$500 and \$4,000 in scholarships.
