Parenting	July 14, 2014	8:35am	1 Minute	On “Parenting Today’s Teens,” Mark Gregston talks about the patience needed as a parent. Sometimes the correction and work we today won’t see its payoff until long down the road. But he says that doesn’t mean it’s not worth it.
Family and Marriage	July 21, 2014	4:35pm	1.5 minutes	On “Real Family Life”, Dennis Rainey talks about the potential affairs that can cause damage to a marriage, including a career affair.
