## Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- **Mental Health:** With the advent of the suicide and mental health hotline (now a shorter "988") a focus has been placed on acquiring help for those experiencing mental health crises, such as extreme stress, anxiety, depression, obsessive-compulsive disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder and other common mental ailments.
- Environment: The main focus here is the extreme drought experienced in the mountain west and the high desert and what challenges we will face in the near future, including the status of several new reservoirs, the potential of the Lake Powell Pipeline and the public relations movement to urge citizens to conserve water.
- **Economy:** We went from high unemployment to very low unemployment, but it came at a cost as a lot of young workers are electing to remain out of the workforce with the federal government subsidizing their current lifestyles and the need to gain income taking a backburner.
- Laws and Legislation: We highlighted the extreme efforts put forth by our first responders, including police, fire and emergency medical personnel. A big issue in Southern Utah was the Safe St. George initiative, which attempted to tax the populace to give raises to the first responders. The Truth in Taxation hearings resulted in this tax being shot down by public sentiment.
- Community Involvement: St. George area is known for its willingness to volunteer and aid in the huge events that have chosen to make the area home, including the Huntsman World Senior games, the Ironman Triathlon and the St. George Marathon. More than 10,000 volunteers are needed to put on these events.
