Quarterly Ascertainment Summary - 1st Quarter 2008

Attached is a report concerning KEZI -TV news stories, local programming, network programming and public service announcements aired over KEZI during 1st Quarter 2008 pertaining to key issues, as determined by the KEZI -TV Community Relations Department.

The five main areas and issues listed below are identified from viewer comments, solicited community comment and ascertainment of interviews with community leaders.

KEZI Key Issues:

- 1) Crime and Community Safety
- 2) Fuel
- 3) Traffic / Transportation / Environmental Planning
- 4) Government
- 5) Land Use / Community Growth

Note:

In December 2007 and January 2008, KEZI launched a new station-wide graphics package change. All PSAs with station audio / logo tagging will be pulled from air to accommodate this changeover. As we end 1st Quarter 2008, KEZI continues improving our PSA delivery and commitment to our key issues by focusing all PSA efforts on these issues and phasing-out older, unrelated public service announcements. KEZI anticipates a fully executed revamp of our PSA schedule by mid-2nd Quarter 2008.

Quarterly Issues and Programming Narrative - 1st Quarter 2008

Programming addressing major issues in 1st quarter 2008 includes the following:

1) Crime and Community Safety

KEZI contributed 2,179 announcements for Crime and Community Safety ranging from foster care issues to building stronger, safer families and homes, and numerous weekly Kids In Crisis and Crimestoppers news franchise reports focused on crime prevention and fugitive capture in news programs and on kezi.com. KEZI also launched a local version of Oprah's Big Give our viewing area with PSAs and news support to raise awareness, funds and items for foster kids and families.

2) Fuel

KEZI contributed 0 announcements towards Fuel in this category due to our PSA review and acceptance guidelines revision. However, KEZI produced a vast number of news stories and online information dealing with rising fuel costs and the impact on our viewing public.

3) Traffic / Transportation / Environmental Planning

KEZI contributed 701 announcements in this category focused mainly on environmental planning through kids inventions and environmental protection message as well as, numerous news packages highlight traffic, construction, transportation and environmental impact stories facing our viewers.

4) Government

KEZI contributed 390 announcements in this category ranging from national election coverage and visits, family safety information, including live coverage of presidential candidate speeches, plus numerous stories and interviews with existing and emerging local, regional and national political leaders.

5) Land Use / Community Growth

KEZI contributed 0 announcements in this category due to our PSA review and acceptance guidelines revision. However, KEZI produced a vast number of news stories and online information dealing with university and municipal land use issues as well as, community growth and housing industry problems curbing growth in our viewing area.

Government	5:00 PM News	Jan-29	5:00 PM	4 mins	A collection of news packages and SOTs addressing the Oregon Health Plans' decision to re-open their enrollment period for the first time since 2004. Thousands of residents flocked to register.
