## **Section 1 - ISSUES**

Townsquare Media provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issue of concern to our local community. This station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing the community this quarter.

- Travel / Law Enforcement / Public Safety: Idaho sees an increased amount of AG
  transportation on our highways and interstates during spring and summer, resulting in
  more traffic related incidents involving trucks, and hazardous materials. How do our
  state agencies handle spills and what can motorists do to help keep our roadways safe.
- Twin Falls Government / Economy: Twin Falls is a growing community with new people and businesses moving into the city and surrounding areas. How is the growth impacting our community and how does the growth effect new and existing business?
- Idaho Government / Health / Criminal Justice: A recent string of ballot initiatives have come through state government regarding the expansion of Medicaid and initiatives to legalize marijuana and raise the minimum wage are on the horizon. How might these proposed measures impact our communities and taxpayers?
- Environment: Southern Idaho residents and business alike depend of water provided by our canal systems and Idaho's underground aquifer. As our area continues to grow, how do we maintain Idaho's water system to ensure our needs are taken care of and how to protect it from the treats of outside interests?
- Education / Politics / Idaho Government: Idaho's SAT scores are among the lowest in the nation. What are our legislators planning to help improve scores?
- Social Issues/Religion: Twin Falls continues to diversify via immigration and an influx in regional migration. How do our cultures and religions blend in a community that is made up a predominantly Christian faith?
- Public Safety: How does the growth in Twin Falls have an effect on public safety? Do we have enough infrastructure to handle disasters and what's being done to grow agencies to meet increasing demand?

Steve Millington, local Republican Chair: Idaho has had a recent string of ballot initiatives come through on various issues and they are picking up on popularity as a means of pushing legislation through to the statehouse. The most recent initiative in the last election cycle of 2018 asked voters to either approve or reject an effort to expand Medicaid to a certain segment of the state population that essentially fall between the cracks. Mr. Millington spoke with host Bill Colley about the impacts that initiative has had and the future of ballot initiatives. The initiative to expand Medicaid forced the Idaho legislature to come up with a solution to fund the expansion. Now, there are other initiatives in the works from other groups wanting to get their issues in front of Idaho voters. Millington is concerned there will be a number of initiatives in the future to legalize marijuana and expand the minimum wage.

Transportation/law enforcement/public health Idaho, and the Magic Valley, has a lot of truck traffic with many businesses and agricultural operations shipping goods in and out of the area. Idaho State Police constantly deal with commercial vehicles and the hazards associated with them. Trooper Ken deals specifically with commercial vehicles and has responds to any incident that deals with a big truck and a hazardous material situation. Trucks haul a large variety of materials, many of them can be dangerous if spilled. Ken explained the dangers of some of those hazards to the public and environment. He also explained how they mitigate those spills and the cleanup of them. Plus, how State Police monitors trucks to make sure they are safe to be on the road. Ken spoke with host Bill Colley about the minimal danger to the public from vehicles carrying radioactive material that is transported through the state. He said the danger is much less than many may think.

# Twin Falls City Council

Twin Falls is a growing community with new people moving to it every day. New businesses are also moving into the city and surrounding areas. The city government is becoming even busier with issues coming up a on daily basis. Council members shared issues on the upcoming agenda and what the public needs to know to be involved with their local government.

5/26/2019 Environment Brian Olmstead, Manager for the Twin Falls Canal Company: The 28:00 Magic Valley, and southern Idaho, live off the water provided by canal systems and a giant underground aquifer. It would be an understatement to say that without the water there wouldn't be much to southern Idaho. As is the case in many communities, there are ongoing issues with the management of those water sources. Brian Olmstead works with the Twin Falls Canal Company as its manager and spoke to guest host Steve Millington on the importance of maintaining the water system and cooperation between a large variety of parties interested in the use of the water. He spoke about the importance of those agreements, the nature of the water system, and how it must be continued if the area is to survive. He also spoke about the concern about future development in the area and threats to the water system from outside interests. 6/9/2019 Education / **Linda Hartgen, Representative, House**: Idaho lawmakers are gearing Politics / up for another legislative session, which is less than 7 months away, Idaho and quest Representative Linda Hartgen spoke on what she is working on. Rep. Hartgen spoke about a recent education report on Government SAT scores being low for the state, but also pointed out how elementary students are leading the state in reading and other areas. She also talked about her job on the State Affairs committee and what they dealt with in the last legislative session, including a bill that would have amended the requirements to get a ballot initiative in front of voters during elections. 6/23/2019 22:00 Religion in Bill Colley hosts an ongoing panel of three Twin Falls area pastors Twin Falls who discuss religion. Twin Falls is a predominantly Christian and Magic community but immigration is creating a demand for other houses of worship. How are we handling and respecting the views of others Valley while maintaining a firm hold our own beliefs. 6/30/2019 Twin Falls Debby Dane, member of Twin Falls Fire Station: Mrs. Dane is a 30:00 Public Safety member of a committee formed by the Twin Falls City Council to look at the need for new fire stations in Twin Falls. The committee came up with a proposal to build at least three new fire stations that would meet the growing need of the community in the future. As Twin Falls has grown there have been an increase in calls for service. Plus, the current facilities are becoming dated and need better accommodations for the public and firefighters. The committee proposed a bond be presented to the citizens of Twin Falls to vote on. Dane explained what the bond was for and how it would be used

to update the fire facilities in Twin Falls.
