

Programming: Chris Wiles, Danville Police Chief, says calls are being made regarding missed court dates, and payment being requested over the phone to clear charges. Wiles warned this is a scam and his department would never call individuals to send money over the phone. He said no local, state, or federal entity would ever call and ask an individual to send money over the phone.
