The University of Hawaii "Athlete of the Week" segment, which features a student-athlete who has demonstrated outstanding skill, spirit, and sportsmanship on and off the playing field, airs during the 9 PM Wednesday news and the Thursday sunrise news.

Editorials ("Think About It...")

General Manager John Fink prepares, writes, and presents editorials for airing on KFVE. During the quarter, two editorials were aired each week, each of which airs twice during the given week. The first editorial airs within KFVE newscasts on Monday, 9-9:30 PM and on Tuesday, 6:30-7 PM, and the second weekly editorial airs within newscasts on Thursday 9-9:30 PM and Friday, 6:30-7 PM. The editorials are typically 75-90 seconds in length.

Living Local With the Baraquios Sundays 9:30-10:00 PM

A half-hour weekly series in which former TV news anchor-reporter Bernadette Baraquio with her sister Angela Baraquio (a former Miss America) feature, in a magazine format, good news Hawaii stories, a look at local people, customs, fashion and entertainment of the Islands.

Public Services Messages

Over the quarter, KFVE aired over 400 public service announcements of thirty seconds in length, as well as dozens of announcements of other lengths. Causes promoted included the Hawaii Foodbank Checkout Hunger Campaign, the Easter Seals Hawaii Gingerbread Festival, and the Hawaii Meth Project.

Local Amateur Athletics (various broadcast times and lengths)

KFVE provides a broadcast outlet for presentation of local sporting activities of special interest to the area. For example, during the past quarter the station broadcast eleven (11) University of Hawaii football games, four (4) University of Hawaii men's basketball games, five

(5) University of Hawaii women's basketball games, three (3) University of Hawaii soccer games and seven (7) University of Hawaii women's volleyball games.
