All of the above programs are locally produced news programs presenting a mix of news, weather, sports and issue-responsive feature stories and segments. Regularly recurring segments include:

- (1) *Aha'i Olelo Ola*: Each week Amy Kalili, a lawyer fluent in Hawaiian, introduces a segment that focuses on issues, people, and events from a Hawaiian perspective. Aha'i Olelo Ola airs Mondays and Fridays on Sunrise at 8:00PM.
- (2) *Cheap Eats*: In these tough economic times, folks are looking for a way to save money. To assist, each week Guy Hagi and Augie T. introduce our viewers to local eateries where they can get great food at affordable prices. Cheap Eats airs every Wednesday during the 6:30PM and 9:00PM news.
- (3) *Hi-Five*: This Segment recognizes Hawaii's local athlete of the week for their high school or collegiate athletic accomplishments. It also features one keiki (child) athlete of the week through photos sent in by the viewers throughout Hawaii. Hi-Five airs every Tuesday during the 6:30PM and 9:00PM news and on Wednesday's Sunrise at 8:00PM.

Editorials ("Think About It...")

General Manager John Fink prepares, writes, and presents editorials for airing on KFVE. During the quarter, two editorials were aired each week, each of which airs twice during the given week. The first editorial airs within KFVE newscasts on Monday, 9-9:30 PM and on Tuesday, 6:30-7 PM, and the second weekly editorial airs within newscasts on Thursday 9-9:30 PM and Friday, 6:30-7 PM. The editorials are typically 75-90 seconds in length.

Public Services Messages

Over the quarter, KFVE aired 1,171 public service announcements. Over 600 were thirty seconds in length ranging from the Aloha Festivals, Big Brother & Big Sisters of Hawaii to the Hawaii Foodbank, the Hawaii Theater for Youth, and BMW's Don't Text & Drive campaign.
