A regular call-in information program dealing with agricultural and gardening issues in Montana. Presented by MontanaPBS in association with Montana State University Extension, this program invites experts onto the panel to discuss everything from pesticide use, and large-scale agricultural techniques to backyard gardening questions and even which mushroom to pick in the woods. In this episode Montana's Chief Water Court Judge Russ McElyea will answer questions regarding Montana's water law, and how that law affects Montana citizens.
Civil War History	The Civil War	9/7/2015 thru 9/11/2015	8pm – 10:30pm	12hrs	THE CIVIL WAR, the award-winning film produced and directed by Ken Burns, rebroadcast over five consecutive nights in September 2015. The broadcast, coincides with the 25th anniversary of the series' initial broadcast in September 1990, will present for the first time a newly restored, high-definition version. This is also the first time the film will be seen with the same fidelity and framing as the negative that Burns and his co-cinematographers Allen Moore and Buddy Squires shot more than 25 years ago. THE CIVIL WAR, an epic nine-episode series by the award-winning documentary filmmaker Ken Burns and produced in conjunction with WETA, Washington, D.C., first aired in September of 1990 to an audience of 40 million viewers. The film is a comprehensive and definitive history of the American Civil War, and the recipient of 40 major film and television awards, including two Emmys and two Grammys.
