City of Shelby Update. Our guest on This, That & The other was Shelby Mayor Gary McDermott who discussed the first council meeting of the year's agenda. The Mayor said the City has been successful in receiving historic preservation grants that would allow them to re-roof and do exterior work on the historic former Shelby City Hall. He noted that two American Rescue Plan funds would allow the city to proceed on with a new phase of the storm drain project and restoration at the sewer lagoon. The city would also be replacing the airport water tank and replacing lines to the tank. The city continues to work on a "quiet zone" the Montana Department of transportation and Burlington Northern RR. It would involve fencing alongside a portion of the tracks near the Galena Street crossing. And the Mayor once again confirmed that local businessman Steve Williamson had plans to build a 48-unit housing-apartment complex on the North side of Shelby.

Toole County Update. Our guest on This, That & the Other was Toole County Librarian Heidi Alford who gave us a rundown of the numerous programs and opportunities that the library offers. For example the Montana Library to go, the state library website that allows users to download e-books, and other things for a two week period, just like checking out a regular book. The libraries in Shelby and Sunburst offer story times for preschoolers once a week. The Shelby library has a reading program called a thousand books before kindergarten. Prizes are awarded for every benchmark of 100 and then a major prize if a thousand is reached. They also have "hot spots" to check out. The Hot spots allow for increased Wi-Fi connections.

Agricultural Concerns. The guest on This, That & the Other was Jeff Habets a rancher between Conrad and Shelby and Brian Grebliunas, who operates a feed testing lab in Chinook. Both were here to discuss an upcoming workshop put on by the Marias River Livestock Association. The workshop will focus on testing feed sources for cattle. During a drought year, the nitrates in some of the feed could be at extremely high levels and cause real damage to cattle health, even to the point of death loss in the cattle and calves. Grebliunas would be explaining how to take samples and how to interpret the reports that come back from the lab.

Community Needs. Our guest on This, That & the Other was David Irvin, head of the Northern Transit Interlocal. The Transit system offers the general public rides to and from hospitals, doctor appointments and other locations in Great Falls and Kalispell. Irvin gave us a rundown on days when the service is running, where it's going on a particular day, and departure times. He also noted it's a free service but donations are accepted.

Toole County Update. Our guest on This, That & the Other was Bob Winney, head of the Toole County Ambulance service. Winney explained that Covid-19 protocols were one thing that the ambulance crews have had to adjust and train for. If they detected symptoms from a patient or were advised that a victim had Covid and had to go into a house they would proceed to full dress, including masks, face masks, gloves and booties. He noted that the Toole County crew had lots of experience in fact so much that they're on the lookout always for new blood as some may be about ready to retire. He told us that the Toole County Ambulance crew averages one and a half calls per day or 400 per year.

Toole County Update. Don Hartwell, Toole County Commissioner talked to Anne about Toole County's updates. Preparing for the Border Freedom Rally and Convoy tomorrow at the Sweetgrass border. Agricultural Concerns. Our guest on This, That & the Other was the director for the Northern Express Transportation Authority Ag port authority in Shelby, Curtis Shuck. Shuck told us that business at the port was holding steady with many who occupy the port to transload everything from pulse crops to junk cars are either expanding or considering expansion. He did note that with the nearby border at Coutts, Alb., Canada closed due to a truckers protest, business at the port was impacted greatly with some movement restricted totally. The port serves Canada, Mexico and the United States and features rail car transloading, a 110 car shuttle facility, lumber transload, palletized product transloading, and bulk rail car transloading.

City of Shelby Update. Our guest on KSEN's This, That & The Other was Shelby Mayor Gary McDermott who gave us a run down on city council projects and a preview of the monthly meeting agenda. The mayor explained that a public hearing would begin the meeting in regard to a zone change on the north side of Shelby and in regard to lighting the coyote walking and

biking trail. Marias River Electric submitted a bid to provide poles and materials for \$60,000 and the City has a grant of \$40,000 to trench the wiring. The mayor also discussed a grant for tearing down the old Bitterroot School and use the property for residential housing. The Council was also expected to accept a resignation from Councilman Aaron Heaton who was moving out of ward 1 into Ward 111.

Toole County Update. Our guest on KSEN's This, That & The Other was Doyle Arves with the Toole County Road dept. Arves told us the County was mainly involved still with snow removal, always making school bus routes and mail routes the top priority. He noted that the department is responsible for approximately 11-hundred miles of road in our rural county.

Toole County Update. Our guest on this, that & the other was Shelby Volunteer fire chief Ron buck. He reported that the firefighters and law enforcement were looking for the public's help in finding an individual who may have started a fire east of Shelby. The fire destroyed two buildings, one a Shed that contained barrels that were exploding and made it dangerous. Buck explained how local fire departments all over the area have written agreements to assist one another if they are called to help. Buck also said that Shelby has one of the most state of the art fire halls in the state and they are fully equipped with 11 trucks including 3 brush trucks, 3 pumpers, 2tankers and more. And he also made us aware that the local department was constructing a monument for firefighters statewide who have served 20-years plus on their local fire department and that there have been 42 in Shelby alone.

She also told us about upcoming election judge trainings march 30th, at 10am in the ambulance building and April 7th in the ambulance building.

The mayor reported that two individuals had expressed an interest in the vacant council position. Jace Yarn was appointed to that position at the Monday night meeting.
