Description: In December of 1965 a UFO of some sort landed in Kecksburg. There has never been an official explanation of what the object was. Our guest, John Ventre, the multi-state director for the Mutual UFO Network, researcher, and columnist, and Mechanical Engineer Owen Eichler believe they have solved the mystery. Ventre says they believe the Mount Pleasant Township UFO incident was most likely the a crash and retrieval of a GE Mark 2 reentry vehicle launched two days earlier. Owen spent ten years researching the theory and is certain he is correct. The GE Mark 2 RV was a spy capsule that was kept secret until 1991. He says there are many reasons the military may have wanted to retrieve and keep secret this spy capsule. He believes no one official will confirm their theory as it would be embarrassing to the U.S. to now admit the existence of this spy RV they have denied since 1965.

Description: Pennsylvania Fire Commissioner Tim Solobay discussed a number of issues of interest and importance to firefighters, government officials, and area residents. The commissioner discussed in great detail the dwindling number of volunteer firefighters across the state. Solobay says in the mid-70s there were more than three-hundred-thousand volunteers across the state and now there are only about 50-thousand. He referenced two state reports, the Senate Resolution 60 Report and the General Assembly's Legislative Budget and Finance Committee's resolution 148 report, which focused on problems of the volunteer fire service in Pennsylvania. Solobay discussed the findings of these two reports. He said the volunteer fire service in Pennsylvania is at a critical juncture. The commissioner said the volunteer system faces significant challenges in overcoming a growing lack of both human and financial resources. Solobay cited skyrocketing costs of fire equipment which has increased much faster than the rate of inflation and cost of living. He said protective clothing for a firefighter has risen to about three-thousand dollars per fireman. Breathing apparatus used to enter burning buildings has increased to about 75-hundred dollars. Fire-engines cost over a half-million dollars and ladder trucks about one-million. He pointed to the over 150-hours for essential basic new firefighter training as another reason people are not volunteering.

Description: Local U-F-O researcher Stan Gordon talked about U-F-O's, Big Foot, and other unexplained matters which seem to fascinate many area residents. Gordon has been interested in U-F-O's and investigating them since 1959. He founded the Westmoreland County U-F-O Study Group in 1970 and is a former director of the Mutual U-F-O Network, an organization from which he won an award. He has written several books and magazine articles, produced videos, and spoken as an expert on TV programs and at conferences about the unexplained. He is a featured speaker this coming weekend at the Monroeville Expo Mart. He discussed at length his involvement in and investigation of the famous Kecksburg, PA U-F-O incident in December of 1965. He offered his opinion on two other researchers who believe they have solved the mystery of the Kecksburg incident. Gordon gave information on his investigation into "Big Foot" sightings in the tri-state area. He talked about other unexplained incidents he has investigated.

Description: Our guest was the Chairman of the Westmoreland County Board of Commissioners. Ms. Cerilli was elected to her first political position as a member of the three-member Board of County Commissioners last year and took office in January. She has her B.A. and M.A in business administration and has just completed her Jurist Doctorate. She is also a former Miss Pennsylvania. She said it was during her reign as Miss Pennsylvania while doing her public service work she decided she wanted to run for public office and be of service to the public. We talked with Ms. Cerilli about what she considers to be the biggest problems facing Westmoreland County and county government. Cerilli is very concerned about the growing drug abuse problem in the area. She talked about the various agencies and departments under the control of the Commissioners. She explained how some agencies are pass-through agencies that are mandated by the state or federal government and just administered by the county. There are other "row" offices and the courts which the commissioners are responsible for funding but are also mandated by law.

Mr. Mertz traced his history from being a Greensburg firefighter from the time he was a teenager, a Greensburg Police Dispatcher, State Police Dispatcher, Deputy Director of the State's Department of Homeland Security and Pennsylvania Emergency Management Official before accepting the Westmoreland County position. The Westmoreland County Department of Public Safety is an umbrella agency responsible for a variety of agencies including 9-1-1, Emergency Management, Park Police, and others. He talked about the importance of the 9-1-1 center which operates 24 hours a day 365 days a year. He said 9-1-1 is the link between people who have emergency problems and the first responders (police, fire, ambulance) who are coming to render aid. He spoke of upgrades and improvements to the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system and countywide interoperable radio system that links all agencies with the center and one another. He explained the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC), a committee of appointed volunteers, who have responsibility for looking at and helping recommend plans to respond to potential emergencies. The volunteer Hazardous Materials Response Team also operates under the direction of the Department of Public Safety.
