DURING THE 3rd QUARTER, The primary election was held for 2014. This included a strange mayor's race in which two candidates were arrested and one was disqualified. The arrests generated heavy discussion as police tazed one of the candidates who disregarded a traffic stop. There was also a special election held because of Hurricane Iselle on the Big Island, and elections officials on Maui found 800 ballots that were unaccounted for during the initial election.

ALSO THIS QUARTER...Maui selected a new police chief. Tivoli Faaumu has vowed to do more to release information citing the Charli Scott disappearance case which shed a poor light on the department during the previous administration. In that case, the suspect, Steven Capobianco was indicted and entered a not guilty plea.

THERE Was ALSO several traffic fatalities, including one that was attributed to speed and alcohol that claimed the life of a Kihei woman who was a passenger. During this quarter police conducted enforcement campaigns targeting speeding, DUI, and Move Over Law violations. They also reminded motorists about an increase in fines for texting while driving.
