January

1-6 - We preview the 2025 elections, and we discuss polling and how it works.

1-13 - Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb delivers his final State of the State address and Indiana House Democrats unveil their legislative agenda.

1-20 - Indiana Supreme Court Chief Justice Loretta Rush delivers the state of the Judiciary and we look at the role of former President Benjamin Harrison in the 20th Century.

1-27 - We examine the controversy with respect to Indiana's 3rd-grade reading scores, and we talk with U.S. Senate candidate John Rust.

February

2-3 - The Republican candidates for Governor tout their conservative credentials at their first public debate.

2-10 - It's halftime at the Indiana General Assembly and we look at the race in Indiana's 5th Congressional District.

2-17 - The Indiana Supreme Court hears arguments in a case that will determine who can run for public office in the Hoosier State, and we had an encore presentation of our interview regarding President Benjamin Harrison.

2-25 - Republicans meet in the 6th Congressional District for their first straw poll. We hear from Andy Downs from the Mike Downs Center at Purdue University Ft. Wayne on the state of Indiana politics, Mike Hicks, economist at Ball State University, chimes in on the economy,

3-2 - We feature election hearing challenges against Donald Trump and U.S. Senate candidate John Rust

3-9 - Libertarians nominate their candidates for office; we speak with Republican gubernatorial candidate Eric Doden and we talk Hoosier energy consumption.

3-16 - Indiana's gubernatorial candidates debate in Carmel, IN

3-23 - Interviews with candidates for office, as well as the President of Vincennes University

3-30 - With early voting a week away, we talk to various candidates for state and federal office.
