- Kenric Ward, chief writer of Virginia's Bureau of Watchdog.Org talks stories from the Virginia State Legislature.
- Discussion of Women's issues with Elizabeth Irvin, Program Director of the Charlottesville Women's Initiative and Amy Chestnutt, Outreach Coordinator from U.Va.'s Women's Center's Eating Disorders Education Initiative.
- Locals Jim Duncan of Nest Realty and Matt Hodges of the President Mortgage Group to discuss how underemployment affects the real estate market.
- Talking about Charlottesville's Legal Aid Justice Center with Alex Gulotta, the Center's executive director, and Brenda Castañeda, an attorney with the Center's Civil Advocacy Program.
- Karl Bitzer, who brought his Cetme 308 into a local Charlottesville Kroger food store, discusses his motives for the incident and the after-effects.
- Licensed relationship counselors Walter Mehring and Cara Marinucci discuss all relationships under the sun—family, friends, intimate, or otherwise.
- The reps of S.A.R.A (Sexual Assault Resource Agency) discuss what the center provides for the community, current legislature surrounding sexual assault, and the social and cultural aspects surrounding the act of assault.
- Steve Koleszar (Chairman, Albemarle County School Board), Dr. John "Billy" Haun (Albemarle County Assistant Superintendent for Instruction) and Dr. Matthew Haas (Albemarle County Assistant Superintendent for Organization and Human Resources) talk about difficult decisions in the public school system – budgeting, hiring and snow days.
