WNRN broadcasts on multiple frequencies throughout central Virginia. Our signals reach Charlottesville, Richmond, Lynchburg, Staunton, Waynesboro, Harrisonburg and Lexington as well as the 21 counties near these cities.

Hear Together is our award winning public service program that we run hourly at approximately 35 minutes past the hour on our airwaves. The content focuses on non-profits to inspire and motivate that listeners will volunteer in their own community. The Hear Together segments provide a platform for WNRN's educated listeners to learn more about the missions of many non-profits.

WNRN radio broadcasts more than 8000 public service announcements each year. Hear Together gives over \$300,000 in free airtime to area regional non-profit organizations. These organizations can then use the profile on their website to seek funds from grantors and for basic education.

WNRN's goal to actively encourage giving back to our community is met by airing messages with direct appeals for volunteers. We know that all non-profit organizations have volunteer boards, run programs that use volunteers, and need volunteers to run fundraising events for their operations. Therefore, we aim to share a wide range of ways to make a difference for every schedule and interest for potential volunteers.

WNRN interviews local citizens who are involved with local non-profits in order to spotlight their community engagement. WNRN staff actively looks for non-profits who are reliant on volunteer engagement but have limited means to recruit. Interested listeners can learn more about each organization by visiting our website for more information, links, and to hear the audio again.

WNRN increases the impact of non-profits that work to address the most significant issues challenging our community. We measure the results of Hear Together using these criteria: count the number of public service announcements aired, how many non-profit organizations were served, and which counties and cities are served. Hear Together regularly surveys non-profits to hear feedback and what the profiles have accomplished for them.

The Second Street Gallery in Charlottesville presents Listening Spirit: 5 Years of Burnside Farm. This collaborative installation features visual art, food activism and programs by Detroit-based artist Kate Daughdrill and New York-based artist Patrick Costello, both former Charlottesville residents.

The 1708 Gallery in Richmond is presenting 5 x 5, a summer program that welcomes 5 artist projects into the gallery for two weeks each. Local artists, including undergraduates and graduates, were invited to submit proposals for how they might utilize the gallery space in an innovative and exploratory way; to test an idea, to experiment with a project, and/or to engage with new audiences. There will be at least one public event during each project's session. Check 1708's website for a list of projects.

July 11th through July 17th.

Art Space Gallery in Richmond is showing People and Places: Photographs from 50 years (1966-2016) by Dan Mouer. The artist will be giving a closing talk at the gallery on Sunday, July 17th at 2pm.

Chroma Projects Art Gallery has moved to a new space on Central Place on the downtown Mall in Charlottesville. Their summer exhibition is Florescence: Jennifer Cox, Michelle Gagliano and Rachel Rotenberg, three artists who evoke, or provoke, the superabundance and primeval sensuality of the botanical realm, to make their art.

The Shenandoah Valley Art Center in Waynesboro is hosting the 2016 Annual Anniversary Member's Judged Show. The gallery is open Tuesdays through Saturdays 10am-4pm.

July 18th through July 24th

This Sunday a new exhibit opens in Richmond at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts. "Gordon Parks in Fort Scott" examines the realities of life under segregation in 1950s America, as seen through the lens of groundbreaking photographer Gordon Parks (1912–2006). As the first African American photographer hired full time by Life magazine, Parks was frequently given assignments involving social issues affecting black America. In 1950, one such project took him back to his hometown in Kansas for a photo essay he planned to call "Back to Fort Scott."

The Kluge Ruhe Aboriginal Art Collection in Charlottesville presents their Night at the Museum this Thursday, June 21st from 5:00pm to 9:00 pm. This family friendly event includes access to the museum's exhibitions, adult beverages, food trucks and activities for the kids.

There is still time to see Maxfield Parrish: Book Illustrations exhibition at Lynchburg College's Daura Gallery. The exhibition continues through July 31st. Considered one of the world's most recognized and celebrated illustrator, this exhibit is a visual feast.

July 25th through July 31st.

The Kehinde Wiley exhibition, "A New Republic" at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond continues through the summer. This powerful exhibition is a retrospective of her masterful paintings that portray contemporary African American men and women using the conventions of traditional European portraiture.

The McGuffey Art Center continues their summer exhibitions with Peter Allen in the Smith Gallery and the McGuffey Art Center Summer Group Exhibit in the hall galleries.

The Rockbridge Regional Art Fair takes place in Lexington July 27th through July 30th at the Virginia Horse Center. Expect to see a wide range of media and styles.

August 1st through August 7th.

In Richmond, This is the final week for the 1708 Gallery's exhibition, Pattern Language for a Social Fabric, featuring the collaborative work of Brooke Inman, Molly Fair, and Jesse Goldstein.

Pattern Language for a Social Fabric is an experiment in open-printing as a means of developing a creative and innovative practice.

The Taubman Museum of Art, in Roanoke, is showing Daphne, an installation by South-West Virginia artist, Eric Standley. Created entirely from laser-cut paper and inspired by Islamic and gothic architectural ornamentation, Standley stacks over 200 sheets for many of his pieces, which involve months of planning, drawing, and assembly.

In Charlottesville, The McGuffey Art Center continues its Members exhibition and open door studio policy. Visitors may go into open door studios and meet the artists while they are working. It's a fun way to spend an afternoon and get to know your local artists.

August 8th through August 14th.

In Richmond, 1708 Gallery's 5x5 project continues with David Moré's THE FOOL!, August 8th through the 20th. THE FOOL! is a continuation of The Idiot and The Idiot Annex previously exhibited at Black Iris and Anderson Gallery. Using discarded materials found near the James River, in the streets of Richmond, and in various dumpsters, The Fool continues the transformation of these items. The piece also includes a mixed media sound installation.

This is the final week for Inessential Beauty, mixed media photography by Deborah Baird, at the Staunton Augusta Art Center. Baird digitally alters her prints using a variety of media. The exhibition runs through August 13th.

In Charlottesville, Chroma Gallery is showing Florescence, featuring the work of Jennifer Cox, Michelle Gagliano and Rachel Rotenberg. The gallery is located upstairs on Central Place on the downtown mall

August 15th through August 21st.

Charlottesville's Kluge Ruhe Aboriginal Art Collection presents their monthly NIGHT AT THE MUSEUM this Thursday, 5pm to 9pm. This family friendly event offers live music, food trucks, adult beverages and of course, a chance to see the powerful Aboriginal art work, currently on display.

The Staunton Augusta Art Center opens a new show this Friday with a reception from 5-7pm. Kaye Lipscomb's exhibition ART IS FROZEN ZEN features several new paintings. Known for her atmospheric abstractions, Lipscomb continues to explore color and surface.

The Nelson Gallery in Lexington is showing FARM TO TABLE, a group exhibition featuring several painters, including Lindsay Diamond, Silvia Gibbs, and Cleveland Morris.

August 21st through August 28th

In Charlottesville, The University of Virginia's Fralin Museum continues its exhibition, Andy Warhol: Icons through September 18th. The exhibition includes silkscreens from the series Saint Apollonia and Cowboys and Indians, both created by Warhol during the 1980s.

Sweetbriar College's Babcock Gallery opens Andrea Eis: Marginalia this week. Eis works in film, photography and fabric and has exhibited all over the world. Her work focuses on the combination of historical text and iconic imagery.

Andrea Eis is an artist working in film.

The Visual Arts Center of Richmond continues their exhibition of work by Emily E. Erb titled "Loosely Loaded." Erb hand paints meticulously detailed textiles that address American historical narratives, political and social inequalities, and environmentalism.

August 29th through September 4th.

This is the final week for the Kehinde Wiley retrospective, A NEW REPUBLIC, at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond. This major exhibition features over 60 pieces including paintings and sculpture.

At The McGuffey Art Center, in Charlottesville, Peter Allen is featured in the Sarah B. Smith Gallery. The exhibition, ATONEMENT, explores layers of meaning through relatively simple images, combined with text that become a part of the visual experience. The goal is to communicate both complicated and subtle concepts.

The Taubman Museum of Art in Roanoke continues their exhibition of NOT FADE AWAY, major site-specific fabric installation by nationally recognized artist Rachel B. Hayes. This massive piece merges the artist's fascination with notions of fragility and power, painting and quilt making, and the interplay of light and shadow.

Sept 5th through Sept 11th

In Charlottesville, this Saturday and Sunday, the Piedmont Virginia Community College Gallery invites you to celebrate the end of summer with an "out of gallery" art experience. On Belmont Avenue, artists have created site specific artwork in the yards of Belmont neighborhood residents. You can join them for a reception on Saturday, Sept. 10, from 1 - 4 p.m., at 750 Belmont Avenue.

The Panell Gallery at Sweetbriar College in Lynchburg presents Set/Repeat/Multiply: Artworks in Sequence, through Dec. 9th. The exhibition will feature about 30 works that incorporate repetitive patterns, episodic or serial narrative, and sequential motifs.

In Richmond, the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts is accepting online applications for fellowships. The deadline is November 4th. The grants are available to professional artists as well as graduate and undergraduate art students. The VMFA website provides complete information

Sept 12th through Sept 18th.

This Friday in Charlottesville, the Piedmont Virginia Community College Art Gallery opens two new exhibits. In the North Gallery, Megan Marlatt will be showing Drawings from the Toy Museum of Catalonia. In the South Gallery, Diana Hale will present The Philpott Lake Project. The reception starts at 5pm and ends at 7pm.

THE LYNCHBURG ART FESTIVAL takes place this Saturday, September 17th, on the E.C. Glass High School Grounds.

In Richmond, the 1708 Gallery presents Douglas Rieger's show, Character Armor through October 22nd. Rieger's sculptures includes a range of media and use bawdy humor to attract the viewer inside and around the sculptures. Rieger says the pieces are "languidly aggressive and perverse, revealing their peculiar primitive nature openly."

The Sarah B. Smith Gallery at McGuffey Art Center in Charlottesville
Presents John A. Hancock's Going Beyond the Window: New Works from the Shaped Landscape Series.

Sept 19th through Sept 25th.

This is the last week to see Realism Unbound: Observation as Narrative, Paintings by Elizabeth Crawford & John Randall Younger, at Chroma Gallery, on the downtown mall in Charlottesville. Their fascination for the extraordinary moments of daily domestic life, transform the familiar into the uncommon. The show closes this Saturday. You can visit the website for gallery hours.

The Jane Sandelin Gallery at The Art Works in Richmond, is featuring surrealist paintings by artist Linda Bronski, in a show entitled Between Darkness and Light. The opening is on September 23rd, 7-10 p.m. The Taubman Museum in Roanoke continues the Rachel B. Hayes exhibition, Not Fade Away. This is a site specific layered fabric installation acts as a giant canopy over the 1000 square foot atrium.

The McGuffey Art Center in Charlottesville presets the 25th Annual Water Color Guild in the Upper and Lower North and South Hall Galleries.

The exhibition includes drawings, prints and photographs that tell the story of the hallowed Aboriginal body and its desecration when colonial scientists stole Aboriginal remains to collect them for research. Shen investigates the politics of death, the body, and race from a unique and often silenced perspective.

The Daura Gallery at Lynchburg College presents Mindful: exploring mental health through art, Curated by the Society for Contemporary Craft in Pittsburgh. The exhibition runs through December.
