WNRN broadcasts on multiple frequencies throughout central Virginia. Our signals reach Charlottesville, Richmond, Lynchburg, Staunton, Waynesboro, Harrisonburg and Lexington as well as the 21 counties near these cities.

Hear Together is our award winning public service program that we run hourly at approximately 35 minutes past the hour on our airwaves. The content focuses on non-profits to inspire and motivate that listeners will volunteer in their own community. The Hear Together segments provide a platform for WNRN's educated listeners to learn more about the missions of many non-profits.

WNRN radio broadcasts more than 8000 public service announcements each year. Hear Together gives over \$300,000 in free airtime to area regional non-profit organizations. These organizations can then use the profile on their website to seek funds from grantors and for basic education.

WNRN's goal to actively encourage giving back to our community is met by airing messages with direct appeals for volunteers. We know that all non-profit organizations have volunteer boards, run programs that use volunteers, and need volunteers to run fundraising events for their operations. Therefore, we aim to share a wide range of ways to make a difference for every schedule and interest for potential volunteers.

WNRN interviews local citizens who are involved with local non-profits in order to spotlight their community engagement. WNRN staff actively looks for non-profits who are reliant on volunteer engagement but have limited means to recruit. Interested listeners can learn more about each organization by visiting our website for more information, links, and to hear the audio again.

WNRN increases the impact of non-profits that work to address the most significant issues challenging our community. We measure the results of Hear Together using these criteria: count the number of public service announcements aired, how many non-profit organizations were served, and which counties and cities are served. Hear Together regularly surveys non-profits to hear feedback and what the profiles have accomplished for them.

Culture Connection for the week of April 4th through April 10th.

This is the final week for Christophe Vorlet's Works on Paper in Charlottesville at the gallery Les Yeux du Monde. Featuring many large scale drawings, this exhibit celebrates one of the areas most successful and talented artists.

In Harrisonburg, James Madison University is showing James Madison: Madison Institutes Collaborative Exhibit in the LISANBY MUSEUM. Curated in conjunction with James Madison Week, this exhibit examines the life and work of the university's namesake and Father of the United States Constitution. The exhibit will include items on loan from James Madison's Montpelier, as well as artifacts from the university's own collection.

The Shenandoah Valley Art center is currently accepting applications to exhibit in their Fall Foliage Art Show. More information is available on their website.

In Charlottesville, Jennifer Hoyt Tidwell and The Bridge Progressive Arts Initiative continue the epic performance piece NO WAKE. The Bridge has more information on it's website. Final dates are April 2, 14, 15, & 16.

Culture Connection for the week of April 11th through April 17th.

In Charlottesville, the Chroma Projects presents Beverly Ress: Before and After Follow Each Other. Beverly Ress explores mortality in these meticulous Rembrandt pencil drawings of natural artifacts, on a plane of heavy ivory-hued paper. Ress often cuts the paper to create additional depth and interest.

The Academy Center of the Arts in Lynchburg presents it's bi-monthly event, Art Talks. This is an opportunity for the community to hear from the artists who are a part of the Academy's network of artists. You can join in this Thursday from 5pm to 6pm.

In Richmond, 1708 Gallery presents Adam Shecter : New Year. Shecter's animated videos blend multiple techniques and employ a range of stylistic notes to craft layered narratives. He will also be showing two video studies and a movie poster which will be available as a takeaway for his film in progress, Satellites. This exhibition closes Saturday, April 16, 2016

Culture Connection for the week of April 18th through April 24th.

This Friday, the galleries at Piedmont Virginia Community College in Charlottesville present the Annual Student Exhibition in conjunction with the Seventh Annual Chocolate Chowdown. This much anticipated event features student work in a variety of media and excessive amounts of excellent chocolate. This high calorie event starts at 5pm and ends at 7pm.

At McGuffey Art Center in Charlottesville the Sarah B. Smith Gallery presents Kelly Lonergan: The Great Chain.

The premise for this show is that all things in the universe are ordered in a vertical hierarchy with the spiritual at the top and base matter at the bottom.

Richmond's Page Bond Gallery is presenting *Landing: New Work* by Isabelle Abbot. Isabelle Abbot is known for her loose, impressionistic paintings of Virginia's mountainous countryside. The exhibition will close on April 26.

Culture Connection for the week of April 25th through May 1st.

This is the final week at Charlottesville's McGuffey Art Center for Margaret Embree's exhibition "Developing a Language".

Using only black and white pigments, Embree explores the unlimited possibilities of a limited palette.

The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond is showing *Thomas R. Schiff: Virginia 360°*. In 2004 Schiff began taking panoramic photographs of Virginia, which feature exceptional historic buildings and beautiful natural environments. This exhibition presents 40 photographs that Schiff made in the Commonwealth between 2004 and 2013.

Washington and Lee University, in Lexington are exhibiting *Washington in Glory* in the Watson Pavillion. This exhibit features a variety of ceramic forms featuring the image on George Washington. Some Americans showed their reverence for Washington by commissioning paintings, prints, and objects decorated with his image.

Culture Connection for the week of May 2nd through May 8th

In Charlottesville, LILY ERB will be opening an exhibition entitled *space//filling//curve*. The show opens on May 6th, 6pm-9pm & May 7th, 12p-5pm. The exhibition will be at Metal Inc. located on Market Street.

Also in Charlottesville, McGuffey Art Center will present Cynthia Burkes' exhibition *Raptor* as well as Salena Hitzeman's *Bicoastal* in the lower Halls, north and south galleries. Burkes Raptors include small and large oil paintings featuring birds of prey and their friends. Hitzeman will show large-scale watercolors. The opening is this Friday, 5:30-7:30.

In Harrisonburg, James Madison University presents *James Crable, Photography* in the Duke Hall Gallery. James Crable, emeritus professor of art and art history at JMU, creates patterned yet geometrically diverse artwork, which has been exhibited in museums and galleries throughout the United States and abroad.

In Richmond, the 1708 gallery presents *Garden Week*, with works by Alex Arzt, Carrie Dickason, Naomi Reis, and Jeff Schmuki. The exhibit invites an exploration of our relationship with the natural world.

Culture Connection for the week of May 9th through May 15th

Closing this Saturday In Charlottesville, Second Street Gallery presents *A Golden State*: 4 artists from Los Angeles featuring Asylum, Defer, Swank and Tazroc, from In Creative Unity. ICU Art is an L.A. arts organization that has been producing graffiti art murals and exhibits since 1993.

The Maier Museum of Art at Randolph College in Lynchburg presents Randolph College, Class of 2016, featuring the work of Studio Art Majors and the final presentations of Art History Majors. The exhibition closes this Sunday.

In Richmond, The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts is exhibiting work by Andre Kertész in their photography gallery. Regarded as one of the most important and influential photographers of the 20th century, Kertész was a leading proponent of seeing the world through a Modernist eye. This exhibition includes thirty photographs drawn from VMFA's collection. Chroma Pop Up Gallery, currently at 853 West Main Street, Ste. 301 in Charlottesville, presents A Consideration of Bees – through May 28th. The group exhibition features Robin Braun, Mary Early, Blake Hurt, Matt Lively, Jason McLeod, Richard Knox Robinson, Suzanne Stryk, and Elsabe Dixon with German Perilla. The show explores bees as both a source of delight and inspiration, as well as their endangered status.

Culture Connection for the week of May 16th through May 22nd.

In Richmond, The Virginia Museum of Art presents LIGHT AND LINE: E. S. Lumsden's Visions of India in the South Asian Gallery.

While visiting the Burmese capital of Rangoon in 1912, English artist Ernest Stephen Lumsden saw a photo of the Ganges River and was inspired to rush to the holy city, commencing a decades-long fascination with India. This exhibition features 130 prints from this period. Charlottesville's McGuffey Art Center presents The Annual High School Show in the Upper North and South Halls. This annual show features works by students from area high schools in a wide range of media.

Also in Richmond's Page Bond Gallery, look for SIGNS OF LIFE: A GROUP EXHIBITION featuring new work by Khaled Al-Saa'i, Marguerite Courtney, Hillary Fayle, Anoka Faruqee, Penelope Gottlieb, Jason Hackett, Ledelle Moe, Jaydan Moore, and Clay Witt. CO-CURATED BY GUEST CURATORS, DR. HEATHER MCGUIRE AND DR. SARA DESVERNINE REED, this group show of contemporary art is grounded in the intersection of time, history, signification, process and abstraction.

The Shenandoah Valley Art Center in Waynesboro presents GREEN, a group exhibition featuring a wide variety of media from several local artists.

Culture Connection for the week of May 23rd through May 29th.

Lynchburg College's Daura Gallery presents Maxfield Parrish: Book Illustrations, curated by Museum Studies student Laura Meisner. Known for his distinctive saturated hues such as "Parrish Blue" and idealized neo-classical imagery, Parrish helped shape America's Golden Age of illustration. This exhibition features illustrations from The Arabian Nights, Poems of Childhood, and Knave of Hearts.

The Spritzer Art Center in Harrisonburg presents their annual members exhibition. Expect a wide range of media representing a variety of styles and influences.

In Charlottesville, the Fralin Museum on the campus of UVA presents Fish and Fowl. This exhibition explores the diverse cultural connotations exemplified by images of feathered and scaled animals. The exhibition presents sculptures, paintings, and prints from various time periods and across multiple cultures in which species of fish and fowl are prominently depicted.

The Academy Center of the Arts in Lynchburg offers up a new exhibition every month, as well as arts related events and workshops.

Culture Connection for the week of May 30th through June 5th.

First Fridays through out central Virginia include:
New City Arts presents YEARNINGS: PAINTING BY JEANETTE COHEN and PHOTOGRAPHY BY STACEY EVANS. The exhibit, which is CURATED BY LESLIE AVA SHAW presents two distinct practices that share the yearning for a simpler life that is beautiful but fleeting.

The Maier Museum of Art at Randolph College in Lynchburg presents Recent Acquisitions: Prints by Robert Kipniss. New York-based artist Robert Kipniss is considered a master of the mezzotint. One of few contemporary artists to employ this technique, Kipniss' prints feature a range of values from velvety black to muted gray to glowing white.
In Charlottesville, Second Street Gallery opens MINE MIND AND SUNKEN CITY, work by TORKWASE DYSON AND JOHN TREVINO. The opening starts at 5:30 and the artist talks begin at 6:30.

Culture Connection for the week of June 6th through 12th.

This Saturday, The Virginia Museum of Fine Art in Richmond presents Kehinde Wiley: A New Republic. This exhibit presents a stunning retrospective of the artist's prolific career through nearly 60 paintings and sculptures. Wiley's work raises intriguing questions about race, gender, and the politics of representation by portraying contemporary African American men and women using the conventions of traditional European portraiture.

The Staunton Augusta Art Center in Staunton is showing Paintings by Jeffrey Stockberger. Stockberger has exhibited widely throughout Virginia and is best known for his figurative and narrative work.

The Smith House Galleries in Harrisonburg offer a variety of exhibitions throughout the summer.

In Charlottesville the LOOK3 festival of the photograph takes over the city. You may have noticed large photographs hanging from trees on the downtown mall, people with cameras strapped around their neck all over the city, and photography exhibits everywhere. McGuffey Art Center, in Charlottesville, is filled with exhibits from the Look3 photography festival until the end of the month.

Artists in Cahoots in Lexington has ongoing exhibitions of local artists and craftspeople with expertise in areas from painting to jewelry and everything in between

The Daura Gallery in Lynchburg presents Fractals: Mathematics & Science in Art. Fractals are many things, including mathematical "objects" produced by a computer. These abstract designs depict fascinating designs of infinite structure and complexity. The geometric shapes have symmetry of scale and designs that mimic naturally occurring patterns. This exhibition is on loan from the South Carolina State Museum.

Culture Connection for the week of June 27th through July 3rd.

Piedmont Virginia Community College galleries in Charlottesville continue with their Annual Student Exhibition throughout the summer. The work ranges from ceramics to Drawings and shows a range of technique and styles.

McGuffey Art Center, also in Charlottesville presents Peter Allen in the Smith Gallery and the annual McGuffey Summer Group Exhibit throughout the rest of the galleries.

The Fralin Museum in Charlottesville presents Wahol:Icons. The exhibition will pay special tribute to the concept of the icon, and the fluid definition of that term in contemporary society. Warhol often played on notions of celebrity through the use of a singular iconic image—repeated, reproduced, and reversed.
