SECTION A: NEWSCAST OVERVIEW AND QUARTERLY ISSUES ADDRESSED

WRBN Radio produces daily newscasts that air on a regularly scheduled basis. A one-minute news tease is aired at the bottom of the hour Monday through Friday between 6:00am and 9:00am. On WRBN, just after ABC news at the top of the hour between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00am Monday through Friday, WRBN airs a 3-minute live newscast. A two-minute recorded newscast airs at 12:00pm and at 4:00pm, 5:00pm, and 6:00pm Monday through Friday on WRBN. These are two-minutes in length. WRBN reports local and area news events and issues on an ongoing basis.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature news stories described below is between 30-seconds and one minute. One to two versions of each story aired multiple times during a 12-hour news cycle and are posted online.

Some of the issues covered in these newscasts and programs during the **first** quarter are as follows. Dates indicate local news treatment unless otherwise noted.

1- CONFEDERATE FLAG

News Treatments: August 12h, 18th, 19th 20th, 21st.

Whether or not the Confederate Flag should continue flying at the Rabun County Courthouse at the Confederate Memorial became an issue when there was a petition to remove the flag. The station covered the issue from the first mention by the county commission until a hearing and vote to let the flag fly.

2- PRAYER IN SCHOOL

News Treatments: September 8th, September 14th

An out-of-the-area group filed a complaint about prayers being led by a principal at one of the local schools. In the complaint letter to the school district, the outside group also complained about a Jesus sign hanging on a utility pole outside of the district offices. We covered the prayer issue over a a two week span with interviews, news stories and reactions from the community.

3-PRIVATE SCHOOL ADDS 5TH GRADE

News Treatments: September 28th

Tallulah Falls School, a private school at the very south of Rabun County, added 5th. The school has been a boarding school for over a century and adding the 5th grade was a big move for the long time education facility in Rabun County.

4- CLAYTON RABUN COUNTY ELECTION - TIGER MAYORS RACE

News Treatments: September 11th

A candidate for mayor in Tiger GA claims the current mayor doesn't retain a full time residence in the city of Tiger. The election commission held a hearing, both sides provided evidence and the commission voted that the current mayor was living in the city limits.

SECTION C: LONG FORM PROGRAMS

1-Coffee Talk

Coffee talk is a 5 to 7 minute public service feature airing live on the Sky963 Morning Show weekdays around 8:45am on WRBN-FM. The program deals with any number of topics that affect the citizens of our community. The following shows aired in the **third** guarter of 2015.

a. Rabun County Public Library

Interviewed Rabun County Public Library Director Stephanie Howard about upcoming events taking place at the library, specifically a lot of different current reading events. Aired July 27th, August 31st, and September 28th.

b. Rabun County Recreation Department

Talked once a month with Roy Quilliams, Director from the Rabun County Recreation Department, or one of the other staff members at the Rec Department who organize programs. Events over the fall including sign-ups for football. Aired July 3rd, August 7th, and September 4th.

c. Paws 4 Life

Talked with David Gerrells with Rabun Paws 4 Life about current events at Rabun County's animal shelter. David discussed specific needs for supplies and volunteers, as well as different clinics and fundraisers scheduled. Aired July 6th, August 10th, and September 7th.

d. CMBA

Talked with Cricket Werkheiser and Jenny Wilson from the Clayton Merchants and Business Association about events taking place in downtown Clayton in the third quarter of the year, such as the continuation of First Friday Fests. Also discussed new businesses coming to the city of Clayton. Aired July 3rd, August 7th, and September 11th.

e. Rabun County Extension Office

Once a month, Amber Arrington for the Rabun County Extension Office came in to talk about current events in the community in the outdoor and agricultural realm. Topics include diseases affecting livestock in the area. Aired July 8th, August 12th, and September 9th.

f. Rotary Club of Clayton

Members from the Rotary Club of Clayton discussed this year leadership of which had been taken over by the Rotary Club and the North Georgia Arts Guild. They talked about all the events and vendors that would be at Celebrate Clayton and how the event would go to fund scholarships for local students. Also talked about was the annual document destruction day. Aired July 10th, August 14th, and September 18th.
