All is calm. But who helps heroes of public safety when their grueling workday is done? Enter, Crisis Response Care. “Our goal from day one is to come alongside,” says CRC director Pastor Mike Henderson of K-LOVE Radio. Crisis Response Care offers dozens of free, expert workshops on self-care for first responders. Classes include titles such as Enhancing Resilience, Managing Relationships During a Crisis and Psychological First-Aid. Discussions take on the harsh realities of grief and trauma and encourage peer support for suicide prevention.

It was the darkest season.” Grappling with this new solo responsibility, the divorced dad turned to his church for comfort and support. He was saddened to find very few Christian resources address the deep loneliness and doubt that many single parents endure. Out of his own need to be part of a welcoming faith community, Beeson founded the Solo Parent Society.</p>

Tremonton City Library, Serving Salt Lake City Area	Local News	4/18/2021	7:30pm	n/a	<p>Rafael Sierra spoke with Debby Carter, Library Assistant at the Tremonton City Library. She spoke about the ins and outs of the library, including a glimpse of how she came to be part of the Tremonton City library. Carter spoke about their mission to provide programs, valuable resources and outreach to the community. She spoke about her staff and the current lack of volunteers mainly due to the pandemic. Carter also mentioned making huge modifications in the way they serve community because of COVID-19, having to implement curbside appointments, reserving books online, and following safety protocols to be able and let patrons back into the library. Carter detailed the vast amount of resources available at the library, including online books, paperbacks, learning programs for all ages and virtual learning tools like resume builders and school placement materials. She said the library is not just a place to check out books, but rather, it's a place of learning, play and discovery. Carter gave information on how to get a library card and library hours. She provided contact information to learn more about the Tremonton City Library.</p>

Wangsgard spoke about her background and how she became par of WCLS. She explained how WCLS oversees several library branches serving Weber County, including one in North Ogden, Utah. Wangsgard talked about serving the community including during the pandemic. She spoke about the different resources they offer, including digital services like e-books, movies and learning programs for different age groups. She also spoke about more traditional assets like paperback books and getting a library card to access library resources. Wangsgard spoke about why she feels having a local library branch is important to the community and how some people can use it to come together. She described some 'do's and don'ts' of the local library and how the library has evolved form being a 'quiet' place to a more dynamic place where people can come and share ideas, learn and interact. Stephens spoke about his background and how he became involved with the City's Parks & Recreation department. He gave an overview of parks & recreation and the different city programs or divisions the department is involved in or coordinates with. This includes city owned facilities, community events, police and fire stations and cemetery operations. Stephens mentioned the importance of having a parks & rec division in the city and the essential role it plays in the community – to give people access to programs and recreational activities that may result in a better quality of life. Stephens spoke about their most important assets, programs and services including its parks, trails, sports facilities, community events, recreational activities, seasonal events and more, may of which are free of charge. He also mentioned some activities that do have a cost, but mentioned a scholarship program offered to underserved groups that can't afford to participate in some of these paid activities, and give them a chance to participate.
