Some medical experts feel antidepressants could be behind the violence of mass shootings. Most of the mass violence involves guns and another common thread is antidepressants. Dr. Peter Breggin has studied these drugs and their effects. The drugs cause agitation, anxiety, insomnia, hostility, aggression, and mania. Antidepressants work on the brain thereby altering the way people think. In addition to driving the person with this amphetamine like affect the antidepressants do a kind of lobotomy. You lose your empathy and your caring. Not all doctors view the drugs so harshly. Dr. Karen Jacobs from the Cleveland Clinic said most of her patients would not be able to function in society without them. She does tell her patients there is a risk. The American Psychiatric Association urges doctors to exercise caution when prescribing a certain type of drug, which includes antidepressants, saying their uses could be harmful. Dr. Breggin said for emotional issues counseling is the best. He says antidepressants could make the situation worse especially in young people.

More Americans suffer from autoimmune disease than cancer and heart disease combined. Our immune system keeps us healthy by attacking invaders like viruses. The immune system can misfire and attack healthy tissue that can lead to over 100 autoimmune diseases like Lupus, Rheumatoid Arthritis, Crohn's Disease, and Multiple Sclerosis. Many do not realize they have an autoimmune disease assuming instead that their difficulty concentrating, abdominal pain, and fatigue are just a part of regular life. Dr. Myers prescribes a clean diet to prevent and possibly reverse autoimmune disorders. Dr. Myers believes autoimmune diseases stem from a condition called leaky gut. She said 80% of our immune system is in our gut and if we have an autoimmune disease it is a problem with our immune system. Leak gut means large openings form along the intestinal wall allowing particles to escape that should not. A leaky gut comes from eating too much processed food, sugar, dairy, and gluten in wheat. Eating a clean diet like a Paleo diet has helped many regain their health.

The explosion of radiation damages just the tumor nothing else. There is no nausea, no burning, and no organ damage. There are only 9 Proton centers in the US, but another 8 are on the way. One of the newest ones is in Hampton, Virginia. This area was chosen because it leads the country in prostate cancer deaths. The cost of proton therapy is about three times the cost of traditional treatments, but most insurance cover the cost. Cynthia Keppel, Hampton University Proton Therapy Institute, said the proton therapy could be used on other cancers like brain, head, neck, breast, and lung. They are working on pancreatic and other kinds of gynecological cancers.

Half of everything we do each day is not a conscious decision just something we do by habit. Bad habits are hard to break and good habits are hard to keep. First is a cue, which automatically triggers us to start. Then comes the routine, which is the behavior itself. Third is the reward, which is what we crave and is the key to remembering that routine in the future. People usually focus on the routine or the action of the habit when trying to break the habit. Charles Duhigg, who authored a book detailing the finding from the scientists, says they now know you must focus on the cue and the reward. You must first identify the cue and then how it relates to the reward. And you can then figure out a new routine to get you to the same reward. If you want to start a new habit like exercise you then need to come up with cues and rewards to help you stick with it. The longer you stick with it the easier it becomes.

Research scientists are saying sitting is bad for you. Americans that have desk jobs are sitting for an average of 9 hours a day. Those who have jobs sitting at a desk all day are being warned they need to take a short break every hour. When we sit down for long periods of time our bodies start to shut down, which can lead to an early death. Dr. James Levine, Mayo Clinic, said the trick is to tell your mind that sitting is the new smoking that sitting is literally bad for you. He said people who sit for extended periods of time are predisposed to developing diabetes. Those who sit for hours at a time he said are more likely to have high blood pressure, obesity, multiple cancers, and more prone to depression. Walking workstations are becoming popular with office personnel. If you cannot walk while working alternatives would be taking the stairs instead of the elevator, use a portable stair stepper, or set your alarm as a reminder to take a lap or two around the work area. People get as much or more benefit from getting up and walking a little bit every hour than going to the gym three times a week. Walk and talk meetings and walking at lunchtime are becoming very popular. When you get home avoid being a couch potato. Each hour in front of the TV is an 11% higher death risk.

The third leading cause of death for young people ages 15 to 24 is suicide. One reason is online predators seducing the young person. Many teens log on to the Internet from the privacy of his or her own bedroom not from a personal computer, but from a mobile device like a smart phone. They are often connecting with people they do not know and the parents are unaware. Dr. Linda Mintle says predators are everywhere on the Internet and they know which sites kids tend to go to. Smart phones are often the weapons used to target the kids. Parents do not realize their teens are living in an entirely different world on social media. There are many different sites besides Facebook, i.e. Instagram, snapchat, ooVoo, kik, and vine. Children are more willing to share information that they normally would be comfortable sharing including nude pictures and mature content. Dr. Mintle says parent should look at every device and ask yourself is there a way to access the Internet and how is the access set up. You should also check all the settings.

Today the Supreme Court takes up their first abortion case in nearly a decade. The death of Antonin Scalia will clearly take affect. His absence means prolife support from the bench will be much weaker. At stake is whether states can enforce safety standards at abortion clinics. They are hearing a case on a Texas statue that requires abortion doctors to be able to admit patients to a local hospital. It also requires abortion clinics to meet the same safety standards that ambulatory surgical centers use, like a hallway needs to be large enough to fit an ER gurney down it in case there are complications. The Texas law case is asking the court to decide; 1. How important is health and safety? 2. Do the states have the right to set medical standards for abortions? Abortion supporters say the law threatens access and is merely an excuse to shut down clinics. They said half the abortion clinics have closed their doors since the bill passed in 2013. Cathy Ruse from the Family Research Counsel said the law does not close any clinics. It sets standards that they are choosing not to comply with. Dr. Charmaine Yoest from Americans United For Life said it is an interesting situation in our country where veterinary clinics, manicurist, and tanning salons are more regulated than abortion clinics, which involves an invasive surgical procedure for women.

The refugee goes through 21 steps from the US to be allowed into the US. The process takes approximately three years.
