Surprisingly, nearly 60% of American consumers surveyed don't feel comfortable in their own skin. The survey revealed that what ultimately killed respondents' confidence included overall body image (68%), skin issues (67%), ill-fitting clothes (64%) and social media (58%).

This brings the total number of Illinois National Guard service members directly supporting the COVID-19 response to about 430.

RECORD 6.6 MILLION FILE FOR UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS AS CORONAVIRUS TAKES ITS TOLL

I announced that, more than 6.6 million Americans applied for unemployment benefits doubling a record high set just one week earlier a sign that layoffs are accelerating amid the coronavirus. The stunning report from the Labor Department showed that job cuts are mounting against the backdrop of economies in the United States and abroad that have almost certainly sunk into a severe recession as

businesses close across the world. The figure is much higher than the previous record of 3.3 million reported for the previous week. The surging layoffs have led many economists to envision as many as 20 million lost jobs by the end of April. The unemployment rate could spike to as high as 15% this month, above the previous record of 10.8% set during a deep recession in 1982.

COALITION OF NONPROFITS CALLS ON CONGRESS FOR \$60 BILLION INFUSION

I announced that Leadership 18, an alliance of CEOs of leading U.S. nonprofits and faith-based organizations, together with the National Council of Nonprofits and other charities, has issued a letter to Congress requesting an infusion of \$60 billion in emergency funding to enable the nonprofit sector to continue serving vulnerable communities affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

"I believe that America's Food Fund will be a powerful way to make a difference for our neighbors in need."

STEPHON MARBURY SETS UP DEAL TO DELIVER 10M MASKS TO NY AMID CORONAVIRUS CRISIS

I reported that Former Knicks star Stephon Marbury will deliver 10 million N95 masks for New York hospital workers and other first responders handling the coronavirus pandemic. Marbury, who played in the NBA 14 years before moving overseas to become a legend in the Chinese Basketball Association, told The New York Post he's made arrangements with a mask supplier in China willing to sell New York 10 million masks "at cost" for \$2.75 each, well below the roughly \$7.50 that N95 retailers have been quoting the state.

The Lansing Police Department is closed to non-essential personnel, so when her friend Sharon Pluard drove her to the station with a large aluminum pan of red beans and rice, another large aluminum pan of stew chicken, a bowl of cole slaw, a tray of pastries, and two 12-packs of Pepsi.

The \$10 million Chicago Street Reconstruction Project includes a new roundabout at Sheffield Avenue and Gostlin Street designed for truck traffic, widened Gostlin Street, new curbs, sidewalks, roadways, and utilities as well as the demolition of the Ardillo's building at the southeast corner of Gostlin and Sheffield to make way for the new roundabout. Overhead and underground utility relocations and building demolition begin now. The project is expected to be completed in October 2021.
