3. **Politics:** Covering local, state, and national politics.
4. **Public Safety:** Covered issues related to police, and crime.
5. **Education:** Covered issues related to education
6. **Health:** Provided information concerning health issues in the community.

### **July 2023**

It is our endeavor to serve the public interest. Here at KVSP Power 103.5, we continuously broadcast issues of concern to Oklahoma City and its listening public. The following is a brief description of these issues that were addressed during this 3rd quarter. We are airing PSA's informing the listeners up to date on various health concerns such as: Disability Pride Month, Mental Health Awareness, as well as Free Health Screenings and Free Food Giveaways.

We continue to broadcast daily and weekly briefings in Oklahoma City with information and services that will educate our listeners. Robin Khouri with (Light Christian Academy) explains how the school is beneficial to children that have loved ones that are incarcerated as well as giving them a top-quality education through a Christian based curriculum. Sherri Coleman and Alyson Parker with the Infant Crisis Center shared the variety of services they offer such as: one week supply of diapers as well as formula. These services as well as others are available four times annually to children from birth to age 3. Representative Ajay Pittman came on and talked about the State Capital and issues the listeners should be aware of. Donna Thompson talked about the 17<sup>th</sup> Annual Awareness Program in the state prisons.

### **August 2023**

We continue to broadcast daily and weekly briefings on the upcoming events. Marilyn Hildreth with the Freedom Festival, talked about Clara Luper being honored during the Oklahoma Freedom Fiesta celebrating 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Oklahoma Sit in. John Bilbury, treasurer and Vickie reporting secretary talked about Trice Hill Cemetery. Pastor Manning (T.A.S.K) Is an outreach Ministry that helps at risk kids and young adults build better relationships in their community as well as with law enforcement by engaging in conversation on a positive note in hopes of building respective relationships. Lt. Wayland Cubit talked about safety in all Oklahoma City public schools. Chevon King from Tulsa talked about real estate in Tulsa.

## September 2023

We continue to broadcast daily and weekly briefings in Oklahoma City first with Liz and Louisa (Kirkpatrick Foundation) Historic Red Ridge estate in OKC to become nature preserve which is a historic 133-acre estate in Northeast Oklahoma City.
