News Report of Stories Covering Critical Needs

At FOX 2, we are so very proud of the bond we have forged with our community. But sometimes the most meaningful words come from those we interact with. After a segment on foster care produced by Connie Smith, we received this email:

"Just wanted to pass along some feedback from Shereen Allen Youngblood following yesterday's segment on foster care. Shereen told me her phone started ringing immediately following the interview, and that she received 50-60 calls throughout the day. She scheduled almost two dozen potential foster parents for orientation sessions yesterday. And she hopes to double that number, once she's able to connect with everyone who called or left a message. The amount of interest generated from yesterday's segment was overwhelming and amazing. THANK YOU for your

support, Connie, and a huge THANKS to the Fox 2 family, as well. If I could, I'd give you hug! :) Thanks for everything ... Kate Fettig Hill.

We are humbled by sentiments like this and use them as fuel for our commitment to the people of southeast Michigan. Regardless of the significance or seriousness of the topic we cover -- crime, courts, government, industry, health, technology -- the thread of community responsibility runs through all we do. It is a privilege to occupy a position that allows us to serve millions ... that is something we never forget.

Here is a sample of our efforts in the second quarter of 2017.

CRIME AND LAW ENFORCEMENT

Flint airport terror. Team coverage, multiple stories. The scourge of random, low-tech terrorism comes to Michigan with the knife attack on an airport police officer by a man shouting about Allah. We broke the fact that the attacker attempted to buy a firearm at a suburban Detroit gun show, was spurned and settled instead for the hunting knife used in the attack. Further investigation determined the man to be a lone attacker residing in Montreal who crossed into the United States from upstate New York. The choice of Flint for the attack remains a mystery. The wounded officer is out of the hospital and recovering.

Fireworks shootings, Randy Wimbley. June 26, 10:00 plus follow-up. Detroit's annual Freedom Festival fireworks show, which draws hundreds of thousands of people to the riverfront for the family-friendly display, is marred by a shooting in the midst of the crowd. Reporter Wimbley got to the scene in minutes and provided a 10-minute live report, with a top Detroit Police official explaining that the wounded bystander would survive, but that no amount of police presence could mitigate the "knucklehead factor."

Female genital mutilation. Team coverage, multiple stories. The nation's first female genital mutilation case expands to include at least six victims of the practice in suburban Detroit. The cutting of young females is done within a small Muslim sect and federal investigators say the suburban Detroit conspiracy could involve as many as 100 victims.

INVESTIGATIVE

Sue Pry, Amy Lange. May 23, 10:00. A Facebook post by Sheila Pry, pleading for information on the disappearance of her sister Sue more than 35 years ago, prompted an investigation by reporter Lange. The story became a history lesson on a sordid side of Detroit in the 1970's including drugs, prostitution and death. The story served as not only a call to help the Pry family, but also to anyone with information on the host of missing person cases haunting so many families.

Bad contractor, Rob Wolchek. May 22, 6:00. Reporter Wolchek exposes a copycat contractor whose business name imitates a legitimate suburban company. The man gains business by exploiting the confusion over the firms' names, then victimizes both the good business's reputation and homeowners by doing shoddy work. Wolchek also found the man has an extensive criminal record.

Estate sale, Rob Wolchek. April 13, 6:00. Wolchek delves into the business practices of a resale shop and finds a legion of dissatisfied customers who say the owner lies to them, delays payments and shorts them on their cash. Making matters worse, his customers include people in a fragile emotional state who have hired the business owner to liquidate the estate of a recently deceased loved one.

GOVERNMENT AND POLITICS

Flint charges, Charlie Langton. June 14, 5:00. Attorney General Bill Schuette charges two high-ranking state health officials in the Flint drinking water crisis. That includes Health and Human Services Director Nick Lyon, charged with involuntary manslaughter and misconduct in office, both felonies. The charges involve a Legionnaires' disease outbreak in the Flint area that led to 12 deaths after the city's water supply was switched to the Flint River in April 2014.

City Council jobs, M.L. Elrick. May 1, 7:00. Detroit City Council members have made hiring Detroiters a top priority -- for everyone but themselves, a FOX 2 investigation reveals. All but three of the city's nine council members have multiple suburbanites on their payrolls, often filling the highest-paying jobs. The justifications they gave Elrick for hiring non-residents often contradicted their public comments on the importance of hiring Detroiters. One council member even hired a communications specialist who lives in New York who didn't know what time zone Detroit occupies.

Mackinac conference, Charlie Langton and Tim Skubick. Multiple stories. Langton and Skubick produce three days of stories from a high-powered annual conference on Mackinac Island, including interviews with new Detroit schools superintendent Nick Vitti and potential players in the upcoming race for governor: University of Michigan regent Mark Bernstein, Lt. Gov. Brian Calley and Macomb County Executive Mark Hackel.

AUTOMOTIVE

The autonomous future, Dave Spencer. May 2, 8:00. The race is on to get self-driving cars on the road and Michigan is the test track. Industry leaders are so invested in idea, they're working together in unprecedented ways to make the "cars of the future" a reality. But are drivers ready to be replaced by a computer? It's a road we've been down before, going from horse and buggy to motor vehicle. Detroit led the way then -- and automakers, tech companies, and the government want to make sure history repeats itself right here in the Motor City. Dave Spencer takes an in-depth look at how Detroit is driving autonomous vehicle development, while reflecting back on the birth of the automobile and how automakers can learn from the past as they try to win public trust in this new technology.

GM shareholders, Roop Raj. June 6, 3:00. A faction of disgruntled General Motors shareholders seek a split of the company to unlock stock value. The push is beaten back by GM brass but the pressure to increase stock price remains.

Ford leadership, Amy Lange. May 22, 3:00. Ford Motor Co. undergoes a major leadership change less than a week after the automaker announced major cuts to its white collar work force. Mark Fields retires after 28 years with Ford with the last three as president and CEO. He gives way to Jim

Hackett, who is described as "a proven transformational leader" by Ford Executive Chairman Bill Ford.

PURE DETROIT

Coney-versary, Charlie Langton and Ryan Ermanni. May 18, multiple live shots. The 100th anniversary of iconic American Coney Island restaurant in downtown Detroit is marked with frivolity including a chili-dog-eating contest.

Kid in swing, Erika Erickson. May 31, 2:00. An 11-year-old who thought it would be a good idea to squeeze into a baby swing finds out otherwise ... fire fighters need to be called to pry the embarrassed lad out of the playground apparatus while a big crowd looks on in amusement.

Racing for Kids, Woody Woodruffe. June 2, 3:00. The Detroit Grand Prix brings more than fast cars and racing fans to the track on Belle Isle. Woodruffe profiles a charity program where drivers meet with young patients, talk about their careers, let them sit in cars and give the children and their parents a break from their difficult situation.

Goat yoga, Hannah Saunders. May 15, 2:00. Urban farmers who also sponsor a yoga program find the experience is accentuated by the presence of baby goats. The kids are as affectionate as puppies and bring a smile and warm feeling to those on the yoga mats.

HEALTH WORKS

Charlotte Ponce, Deena Centofanti. June 26, 3:00. We follow the progress of Charlotte Ponce, disfigured as a three-month-old almost 15 years ago. She was attacked by a raccoon that got into her room and then her crib. Since then, she's endured multiple surgeries to rebuild her face and ears, including one in 2014 where doctors removed cartilage from her ribs and put it into her arm so she could grow an ear.

Kathy Walsh, Amy Lange. June 14, 5:00. Lange profiles the health battle waged by former WJBK reporter Kathy Walsh. She was diagnosed in 2013 with Huntington's Disease, a rare and incurable condition described as a mix of Parkinson's, MS and Alzheimer's -- all at once. We look at ways to manage the disease -- yoga seems to offer some relief -- and how Kathy, her husband and son cope with this difficult family dynamic.

Chris Cornell, Raj and Erickson. May 18, multiple stories. The community and music world at large is shocked by the suicide of Soundgarden lead singer Chris Cornell just hours after a show in downtown Detroit. His death brings into focus the possible factors leading to suicide including depression and drug use.

FRANCHISES

Tech talk, Derek Kevra. A weekly franchise that looks at popular new technology and gadgets, helping to explain how they work and why they are revolutionary. The franchise highlights not just large-scale national releases, but also local tech companies and startups. Additionally, the weekly segment addresses topical technology questions on a local scale.

Amy's Angels. Morning show anchor Amy Andrews tells the stories of people who stand out for the right reasons ... their commitment to helping others and conducting themselves in charitable and inspirational ways.

Let It Rip, every Thursday at 10:30pm and Sunday at 9:30am. Huel Perkins, Charlie Langton and Maurielle Lue host a 30-minute examination of news-based topics driving community opinion and discussion. We invite guests involved with the stories to come to the station as panelists and drill deeply into complex subjects, pushing past episodic coverage. Topics included the fight over deportations to Iraq, criminal charges in the Flint water probe, sex crimes involving the Michigan State University football team, concealed weapon law relaxation, reaction to James Comey's testimony, the call for a part-time legislature, lack of civility in politics, legalizing marijuana, a discussion of Detroit schools with new superintendent Nick Vitti, Detroit's population, Trumpcare vs. Obamacare, the cruise missile strike on Syria, how to pay for the massive sinkhole in Fraser, mandatory surveillance systems for businesses in Clinton Township, the Flint airport terror attack, female genital mutilation arrests, violence live on social media, and character issues involving the Detroit Lions and the NFL draft.
