October 1, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues and Economic Issues and Aging

Guest: Brenda Shuttlesworth the Executive Director of the Alzheimer's Association North Central Texas Chapter

Topic: Earlier this week the wife of actor Bruce Willis sat down with the Today Show to talk about her husband's diagnosis of frontal temporal dementia to raise awareness about his condition and the work of the Alzheimer's Association. Brenda joined me to talk about the Alzheimer's Association's work in North Texas to help those families dealing with Alzheimer's and dementia from support groups to helplines to respite care and the work that they do to fund important research to find better treatments and hopefully one day a cure. We also talked about signs that families should be on the lookout for that a loved one may be dealing with a form of dementia and we talked about the financial impact of the disease on the family and what caregivers go through. We also promoted the upcoming Walk to End Alzheimer's events across North Texas from Fort Worth to Dallas and how important the event is to raise awareness and research funds.

October 8, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: LGBTQ + Rights and Fighting Discrimination

Guests: Dustin Vyers and Regina Lynn Pierce the co-chairs of Black Tie Dinner

Topic: In the last few years states have been advancing a record number of bills that attack LGBTQ + Rights and the LGBTQ+ community is doing what it can to fight for their civil rights and to raise awareness about issues that impact them. Black Tie Dinner is one of the largest fundraising dinners for the LGBTQ + Community in the nation and it happens every year here in North Texas. Dustin and Regina joined me to talk about this year's event and the beneficiaries for the event in 2023 and the work that those organizations do to help those in LGBTQ+ communities. Among the beneficiaries this year AIDS Services of Dallas, Big Brothers and Big Sisters Coalition for Aging LGBT and Dallas Hope Charities and the Human Rights Campaign Foundation. We talked about the issues facing those in the community and the importance of voting for candidates who will work for the community.

October 15, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Education and Learning Differences and Economic Issues

Guests: Suzanne Stell the Executive Director of Shelton a nonprofit school that helps those with Learning Differences and Charles Mitts a senior at Shelton who has Dyslexia and Dysgraphia and Chonnie Rich the founder of Independence Gardens. Topic: The month of October is Learning Differences Awareness Month and Suzanne and Charles joined me to talk about the work that Shelton School does to help those with learning differences. Charles shared his own journey and how he was diagnosed at the age of 5 with dyslexia and how his parents had tried everything, and he felt out of place and dumb until he was enrolled at Shelton and found a better way to learn. We also talked about the community outreach that Shelton does to help parents who are unable to send their kids to Shelton and we talked about financial obstacles that can keep parents from seeking help for their kids. Suzanne shared the importance of early diagnosis and signs that parents should be on the lookout for that perhaps their child learns differently. For the second segment of the program Chonnie Rich joined me to talk about the work that Independence Gardens does building community gardens at schools in North Texas to teach children about gardening, nature and cooking and by doing that they improve the child's nutrition. Chonnie also talked about the upcoming Bikers in Wonderland fundraiser that will raise funds for the gardens and raise awareness about the work that the nonprofit does.

October 22, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime Prevention, Economic Issues, and Domestic Violence Awareness and Child Welfare Issues and Child Abuse Prevention.

Guests: Liz Robinson the Senior Director of Development and Corporate and Retail Partnerships at the Family Place and Lynn McClean the CEO of Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County.

Topic: October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and Liz joined me to talk about what we should all know about family violence including the signs to be on the lookout for and the impact that this problem has on families and on our community. Liz, talked about the work that the Family Place does to raise awareness about the issue of domestic violence but also to help the victims and their families. We talked about safety planning; the abuse hotline and ways to help those who are being abused. We also talked about the Partners Card campaign which will raise funds for the Family Place's services and programs including their transitional living and emergency shelters. We also talked about the increase in dating violence among young people. Lynn McClean the CEO of Childrens Advocacy Center of Collin County joined me for the second half of the program to talk about the upcoming Teddy Bear Ride that will benefit the Children's Advocacy Center and their work with abused and neglected kids in Collin County. The ride will take place on Sunday, October 29<sup>th</sup> and will raise awareness and funds for the Advocacy Center. Lynn talked about what we can do to make sure we are checking up on children to make sure they are okay and she talked about the work that the Advocacy Center does to help children and their families. We also talked about the signs that people should be on the lookout for if they fear a child is being abused and how to report. Currently it is estimated that every ten seconds there is a report of child abuse in the US and most of the time the child knows their abuser and Lynn says that for every adult educated on child abuse at least ten children are made safer.

October 29, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic issues and Education and Community Outreach

Guests: Zoe Murphy one of the Chairs of this year's Chi Omega Christmas Market, Amy Jones the CEO of The Dallas Area Rape Crisis Center and Mike Peters the Executive Director of RISE Adaptive Sports.

Topic: Zoe, Amy and Mike joined me to talk about the upcoming Chi Omega Christmas Market which will be held November 15<sup>th</sup> thru the 18<sup>th</sup> at the Automobile Building at Fair Park in Dallas. Zoe talked about the event, now in it's 46<sup>th</sup> year, and how it raises funds for several beneficiaries every year and this year The Dallas Area Rape Crisis Center and RISE Adaptive Sports are among those beneficiaries. Amy talked about the work that the Rape Crisis Center does to help those who have been assaulted and she also shared information for people to help keep them safe and she talked about the advocacy that the Center does to help women who have been victimized get justice. Mike Peters shared the vision of RISE Adaptive Sports to help those who are physically challenged participate in group sports like football and basketball and now even pickleball. He shared his own journey of facing physical challenges and how he felt left out in sports but now thanks to RISE he can enjoy competitive sports.

November 5, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues, Veterans Issues and Substance Abuse

Guest: Major Dawn McFarland the Co-Commander of the Salvation Army North Texas

Topic: The holiday season is now kicking in to high gear and recently the Dallas Cowboys announced that the half time entertainment for this year's Salvation Army Big Red Kettle Kick Off at the Dallas Cowboys Thanksgiving Day Game will be

Dolly Parton. Major Dawn McFarland joined me to talk about the Red Kettle Campaign, which is the Salvation Army's biggest fundraising campaign, and the impact that it makes on the families here in North Texas who are in need of the services of the Salvation Army. Major McFarland talked about their Veterans services to help those veterans who are homeless and those who are in need of mental health services, we also talked about their programs to help those who are facing substance use issues and the help they provide to children as well as their work following natural disasters in our area. We promoted not only the Red Kettle campaign but also the Angel Tree Program ahead of the holidays to help kids who may not get toys over the holidays and their Thanksgiving and Christmas meal programs.

November 12, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Veterans Issues and Mental Health Issues and Economic Issues

Guest: Jacob Schick the Executive Director of One Tribe Foundation

Topic: It is Veteran's Day weekend, and we highlighted the One Tribe Foundation a nonprofit whose mission is to create a community that raises awareness and combats suicide by empowering veterans, first responders, medical frontline workers and their families through traditional and non-traditional therapies. Jacob Schick talked about the programs that they offer and offered advice to veterans who may be struggling with mental health issues but who may be reluctant to ask for help. Jacob shared his own personal journey with depression and how the One Tribe Foundation helps him to help others through their peer-to-peer programs. He also talked about the other nonprofits that they work with to make sure that any veteran who needs help can find a program that can help them.

November 19, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Health Issues and Community Involvement

Guests: Jill Cumnock the CEO of the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas and Pat Staudt with Bank of Texas

Topic: Jill Cumnock with the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas joined me to talk about the Trains at North Park which benefits the Ronald McDonald House. The Trains at North Park are up and running through January 7th and Jill talked about what people can expect this year. Pat Staudt with Bank of Texas, the presenting sponsor of the event, joined Jill to talk about the importance of the event and why Bank of Texas is proud to support the work that the Ronald McDonald House does. Jill talked about that very work that the Ronald McDonald House does as a home away from home for families who have a child being treated at one of our many children's hospitals and how the house is able to economically help those families who are already spending so much money on their child's healthcare. We talked about the scholarship program they have set up for children who have spent time at the Ronald McDonald House and their siblings so that they can go to college and we talked about the many volunteer opportunities and the ways that the community can help.

November 26, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Animal Welfare and Animal Rights and Protection

Guest: Natalie Buxton the Marketing Director for Operation Kindness

Topic: It is the Sunday after Thanksgiving and as the holidays kick in to high gear we focused on the theme of "Home for the Holidays" shining a spotlight on Operation Kindness one of the leading lifesaving animal shelters in North Texas that aims to find forever homes for animals in need. Natalie Buxton talked about Operation Kindness' holiday campaign at the Galleria of Dallas where they will be set up from now until December 24<sup>th</sup> with dogs and cats that are available for adoptions. Natalie talked about the need for people to adopt animals or to foster animals and we also talked about the other programs that Operation Kindness offers in our area from lifesaving medical care to a pet food pantry to affordable veterinary services to disaster response services and help for people so that they can keep their pets and more.

December 3, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Child Welfare, Adoption, Foster Care and Economic Issues and Education

Guest: Allicia Frye the CEO of Jonathan's Place

Topic: The theme of today's program was once again Home for the Holidays and Allicia Frye with Jonathan's Place joined me to talk about the work that Jonathan's Place does to find foster parents for children in their care and their work to encourage people

to adopt thru foster care. Allicia talked about the history of Jonathan's Place which provides safe spaces and promising futures for abused and neglected children and teens and young adults. We talked about the many programs they have to help the children that come into their care and the work that they are doing to help homeless teens now that they have taken over Promise House. We also shared the impact that Jonathan's Place has and how the community can help them during the holiday season.

December 10, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy and Education and Child Safety

Guest: Karen Hughes the President and CEO of Vogel Alcove a nonprofit that helps homeless children in our area.

Topic: Karen Hughes joined me to talk about the upcoming Day 1 DFW a benefit event that will be held January 1<sup>st</sup> at the Irving Convention Center with proceeds benefitting Vogel Alcove. Vogel Alcove is a nonprofit that helps the youngest victims of poverty in North Texas, homeless children. Karen talked about all the fun activities that will take place at Day 1 DFW but also the importance of an event like this to raise awareness about the issue of homeless children since so many people think the homeless are alcoholics or drug addicts and don't think of the youngest victims and their families. Karen talked about the programs that Vogel has in place to help kids from infant to 15 and their families as well so that the parents can get on their feet and break the cycle of poverty. We talked about the importance of early education for homeless children and how the programs offer a mental safety net for the kids so that they can feel safe and loved and not afraid of their financial circumstances or feel less than other kids.

December 17, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issue and Transportation and Infrasstructure

Guest: Andrea Sign the Director of Marketing and Donor Relations for Carter Blood Care and Jeamy Mollina with DART Dallas Area Rapid Transit.

Topic: The holiday season can be a difficult time for blood centers because people who normally donate blood often times forgo donating due to the holidays but the need for blood is constant. Andrea Sign joined me to talk about the importance of taking time out to donate blood during the holiday season and how your blood donation can help save up to three lives. We talked about the donation process, who can donate blood and we also dispelled myths surrounding blood donation. We talked about the people that are counting on blood donations for surgeries, for cancer treatments and in case of serious accidents. Andrea also talked about other services that Carter Blood Care offers here in North Texas. For the second part of the program, I was joined by Jeamy Molina with DART Dallas Area Rapid Transit who talked about DART's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary. We talked about the impact that DART has had on transportation in North Texas and their plans for the future and how transportation issues in North Texas affect our economy and growth.

December 24, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Caregiving, Elderly Care, Health Issues, Economic Issues

Guest: Susan Williams the Associate State Director of Outreach and Advocacy at AARP Texas

Topic: It is Christmas Eve and today we are focusing on the issue of Caregiving and the conversations that families should have sooner rather than later so that a caregiving plan is in place before you are forced to decide. It was Christmas Eve of 2007 that my own family needed to put in to place our caregiving plan for my mom when her dementia took hold, and she could no longer live on her own. Susan Williams talked about AARP's services that help people navigate the caregiving journey, we talked about their downloadable guides and their caregiving plan that has questions and answers for people. We also talked about resources that are available thru nonprofits that work with AARP and the economic ramifications that caregiving has on the family. We also talked about the other programs that people can take advantage of with AARP including help with navigating Medicare, social security, and more.

December 31, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues,

Guest: Pennie Beauchamp the Interim Executive Director of Mental Health America of Greater Dallas

Topic: On this New Year's Eve as we make plans for the new year I wanted to focus on the issue of mental health. So many

people think that they will get physically fit in the new year, but it is time to also put an emphasis on being mentally fit. Pennie Beauchamp joined me to talk about mental health issues and how this time of year can be difficult for people because they are missing a loved one, they may have lost in the past year or maybe they are comparing themselves to other people thinking that others have a much better life. We talked about the services and programs Mental Health America of Greater Dallas offers, their mental health checkups that people can take online, their community outreach with the WHO program, We Help Ourselves, the mental health training and support for first responders and teachers, their support groups for those who suffer from a mental health issue and we talked about ways that loved ones can spot whether or not a loved one is struggling.
