#### April 2, 2023

Aired 6am to 6:30am

30-minute program

Issues Covered: Education, Community Involvement, Children's Health and Economic Issues

Guests: Dustin Miller the Vice President of Experiences and Guest Services at the Dallas Arboretum and Marissa Chaney the Executive Director of Speedway Children's Charities North Texas.

Topic: Dallas Blooms is now running at the Dallas Arboretum, the North Texas nonprofit that offers events for the community throughout the year that include education programs and horticulture training, and Dustin Miller joined me to talk about the event which is the largest annual floral festival in the Southwest and he also talked about the educational programming offered at the Arboretum throughout the year. The programs include the Children's Garden, the homeschool programs, summer camps and school outreach. We also talked about the Cool Thursday Night Concert Series that is kicking off April 6<sup>th</sup> thru the end of May at the Arboretum featuring a Santana tribute band, a Barbara Streisand tribute band, a Springsteen tribute band and more. The event raises awareness and offers a wonderful opportunity for the community to come together. For the second half of the program, Marissa Chaney the Executive Director of the Texas Chapter of Speedway Children's Charities joined me to talk about how Texas Motor Speedway gives back to the community year round by raising funds at their races for children's charities that focus on education, health, economic issues and child abuse prevention. Marissa explained how Speedway Charities works and how they select the nonprofits that will benefit from their fundraising events at Texas Motor Speedway.

Guests: Jacquelin Leach the Senior Executive Director of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of North Texas and Chloe Hunt the Pediatric Honored Hero for this year's Crohn's and Colitis Foundation Take Steps Walk.

Topic Jacqueline Leach and 14 year old Chloe Hunt joined me to talk about the upcoming Take Steps Walks which will take place in Dallas and Fort Worth in May. The event will raise awareness about IBD and raise funds for the programs offered by the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of North Texas. Chloe shared her story of being diagnosed with Crohns when she was 12 years old and how for the longest times doctors did not know what was going on and how that impacted her mental health and how she lost so much weight that she almost died of malnutrition and had to use a wheelchair to get around. She talked about getting her diagnosis and the hurdles she has had to overcome including multiple hospitalizations. She talked about her dreams for the future and the hope that one day there will be a cure or better medications for someone like her. Jacqueline talked about ways that the foundation builds a community so families like Chloe's don't feel so alone when they are diagnosed and how they offer up a camp for pediatric IBD patients.

Guests: Francoise Van Keuren the Executive Director of Earth Share Texas and Kelsey Key the Creative Director for Earth X based in Dallas.

Topic: April 22<sup>nd</sup> is Earth Day, the annual celebration that honors the achievements of the environmental movement and raises awareness of the need to protect earth's natural resources for future generations. Here in North Texas we can celebrate at the annual Earth X Expo at Fair Park in Dallas. Earth X is the largest event of its kind and features hundreds of exhibitors from the nonprofit world and businesses dedicated to helping the environment. Kelsey Key joined me to talk about Earth X and what people can learn at the event and how the event educates and inspires people to take action towards a more sustainable future.

Francois joined me to talk about Earth Share Texas and how they support local environmental and conservation charities across the state. We talked about the issues facing the state when it comes to air pollution, water shortages, waste and more and how the community can do their part to make a difference so that future generations won't have to deal with climate catastrophes.

April 23, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Mental Health, Education and Economic Issues Guest: Dr. Athena Trentin the Executive Director of NAMI North Texas.

Topic: The Surgeon General of the U.S. recently announced that lonliness is becoming a national epidemic and he also warned about the rising suicide rate among the youth in our country. The month of May which is coming up in National Mental Health Awareness Month and so I asked Dr. Athena Trentin the head of NAMI North Texas to join me to talk about the work that they do in our area to help those impacted by mental health issues. Dr. Trentin talked about the work that NAMI does year round to help those who are dealing with depression, bi-polar disorder, schizophrenia and other mental health disorders. We talked about their education classes, their family to family program and we talked about what people should know about mental health and how to take care of their mental health. We also promoted their upcoming NAMI Walks North Texas which will be held on Saturday, May 6<sup>th</sup> at Riders Field in Frisco. The event will raise funds and awareness about Mental Health issues and hopefully help fight the stigma that surrounds mental health issues.

Guest: Susan Wood the Executive Director and Co-Founder of the Hope Center for Autism

Topic: The month of April has been Autism Awareness Month and Susan Wood with the Hope Center for Autism joined me to talk about the work that they do to help those who have diagnosed and their families. As the co-founder Susan shared why she created the nonprofit and she also talked about what she wished more people knew about Autism Spectrum Disorder. We talked about the signs that people should be aware of so that they can make sure to get an early diagnosis, we talked about misconceptions that people have when it comes to Autism and people who have been diagnosed and we talked about research into the cause and also into therapies and medication. Susan also talked about their upcoming Kentucky Derby Party on May 6<sup>th</sup> that will benefit the Hope Center for Autism and the upcoming Golf Tournament on June 26<sup>th</sup> and we talked about other ways that people can help. Receiving a diagnosis is the first step but for families who receive a diagnosis treatment and therapy can be costly and is a lifelong journey.

Guest: Joan Cutler the Veteran Program Manager at Equest

Topic: The Month of May is Military Appreciation Month set aside to honor the service and sacrifice of members of the military and with Memorial Day coming up and the annual Carry the Load set to take place that weekend I wanted to highlight an area nonprofit that will benefit from this year's Carry the Load Memorial March and so I invited Joan who represents the military outreach that Equest does to be on the program. Joan Cutler talked about the work that Equest does in providing equine therapy to those on the autism spectrum, those with disabilities and also those with mental health issues including our men and women in the military. We talked about how equine therapy works and the Hooves to Heroes program that Equest offers to veterans. We talked about the impact that equine therapy has on veterans and the feedback that they get from veterans. We also discussed their Horses and Literacy program which helps students learn to read

Guest: Kevin Hall the President of the Grant Halliburton Foundation

Topic: It has been a week now since the horrible mass shooting at the Allen Outlet Mall that claimed the lives of 8 innocent people and with so many people in our community dealing with feelings of sadness, anger and frustration as our country faces another mass shooting I invited Kevin Hall with the Grant Halliburton Foundation to join me to talk about mental health and how people can deal with their emotions. We talked about the services that the Grant Halliburton Foundation was providing to those

impacted by the mass shooting and what sort of issues might arise after witnessing such a horrific scene of mass murder. We also talked about the other services and programs that the foundation offers to young people and their families, what kids are facing and how the month of May is Mental Health Awareness Month and we talked about the Mental Health Navigation line that helps people find resources for their family.

May 21. 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Child Safety Issues, Foster Care, Crime and Economic Issues and Mental Health Issues Guest: Paige McDaniel the President and CEO of Community Partners of Dallas and Shannon Smith with Texas Search and Rescue

Topic: The month of May is Foster Care Awareness Month and one of the North Texas nonprofits that helps foster kids is Community Partners of Dallas and Paige McDaniel joined me to talk about the work that they do to help CPS workers and foster families providing clothes and other necessities for a child who is removed from their home and put in foster care. Paige talked about the needs of the children and how the community can help Community Partners. We talked about the reality of what CPS workers go thru and the high turnover in the job that makes it difficult for children when there are so many foster kids and so few CPS workers. We talked about the mental health needs of the kids and the events that Community Partners holds to celebrate holidays, birthdays and back to school. Shannon Smith with Texas Search and Rescue joined me for the second half of the show to talk about the work that they do following natural disasters in the state. They help after tornadoes, wildfires, flooding and other natural disasters and they are always looking for volunteers. Shannon talked about the work that they do, the training and the impact that they have in aiding communities who are reeling following a natural disaster and how they also help in the case of missing persons in land searches and water rescues.

May 28, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program Issues Covered: Military and Veteran support services and Mental Health Issues and Economic Issues. Guest: Jacob Schick the Executive Director of One Tribe Foundation Tonic: It is Memorial Week end a time to remember those who have fallen in service to our country ar

Topic:. It is Memorial Week end a time to remember those who have fallen in service to our country and once again this year on Memorial Day weekend in Dallas it is the annual Carry the Load March at Reverchon Park in Dallas. The March raises awareness of the true meaning of Memorial Day and also raises money for charities helping our military and first responders. One of the beneficiaries of this year's Carry the Load March is the nonprofit One Tribe Foundation formerly 22 Kill. Jacob Schick is the Executive Director of the nonprofit and he joined me to talk about how his agency is helping with the mental health needs of our veterans, The One Tribe Foundation was started as a result of the alarming number of suicides amongst our veterans with national statistics showing that on average every day 22 veterans take their own life. Jacob talked about the importance of raising awareness about the suicide epidemic plaguing our country's veterans and how One Tribe offers support programs that provide services to our vets so that they can overcome depression and anxiety. Jacob shared his own personal journey. He was severely injured in Iraq and lost his leg to combat but it was the invisible wounds of battle that almost cost him his life and that is why he is committed to helping those who are dealing with suicidal thoughts. We also let people know that if they are in crisis that there is help and how the One Tribe Foundation can be a resource for those veterans who feel hopeless.

June 4, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues and Sobriety and Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention

Guests: James Black the Senior Public Relations Specialist for Carter Blood Care and Betty Dicken the Founder of Artists and Musicians in Recovery

Topic: James Black joined me to talk about the year round need for blood but how the summer months are especially tough for blood banks since regular donors go on vacation and the high school blood drives are on hold since school is out. We also talked about the need for blood after tragedies like the mass shooting at the Allen Premium Outlets in early May and how people often times go out to donate during tragedies not realizing that the need for blood is constant. Because of the need during the summer months our radio stations conduct a Summer Blood Drive that will take place June 12th through June 17th at various locations around the Metroplex. It is estimated that every two seconds someone in the US needs blood and James talked about the work

that Carter Blood Care does in our area to educate people about the need for blood and how to help out and encouraged people to donate blood or to hold blood drives at their churches, schools or place of business this summer. We talked about misconceptions about giving blood and who is eligible to donate and how many people are impacted by one donation since blood is used for burn patients, patients undergoing chemotherapy and victims of car accidents or gunshots. Betty Dicken joined me for the final portion of the program to talk about the upcoming Artists and Musicians in Recovery Signature event that raises awareness about how art and music can help those in recovery from drugs and alcohol abuse. Betty talked about why she created the nonprofit and the work that they do and the tough road for people who are in recovery.

June 11, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program Issue Covered: Economic Issues, Education and Food Insecurity

Guest: Benaye Wadkins Chambers the President and CEO of Crossroads Community Services.

Topic: The current economic situation in the United States is leading more and more people to turn to food pantries across North Texas, people who had thought that the worst was behind them from the pandemic who are now struggling more because of the high cost of gas and food. Benaye joined me to talk about the people that she serves with CrossRoads Community Services a nonprofit whose mission is to nourish our community's low income families and individuals by providing nutritious food and supportive education. We talked about how bad food insecurity is right now and we talked about the summer feeding program that is currently underway to help families who normally rely on free lunch and breakfast for their kids during the school year. We talked about the reality of hunger in North Texas and the consequences of that on our community and economy. We also talked about the research that is going on into how to solve the issue of food insecurity at SMU and at UT Dallas and how the SNAP program helps lift people up out of poverty and also helps businesses who sell groceries.

Guest: Bill Eubanks III the CEO of Dallas Habitat for Humanity

Topic: The month of June is National Homeownership Month aimed at reflecting on the impact that owning a home has on household wealth and neighborhood stability. Bill Eubanks joined me to talk about the work that Habitat for Humanity does and who qualifies for a Habitat home and the process of getting into a home. We talked about their education classes that are available to anyone no matter if they are looking at Habitat for Humanity to be able to get in to a home or if they are financially able and just need to figure out the best way to set aside money for down payments and home expenses once you get in a home. We talked about the feedback they get from people and the impact that Habitat has on home we also talked about ways the community can help.

June 25, 2023 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Child Issues, Education Economic Issues and Health Issues

Guests: Stephanie Bohan the CEO of Hope Cottage and Brian Hawkins the CEO of HHM Health

Topic: Hope Cottage is celebrating it's 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and Stephanie and Brian joined me to talk about the partnership that Hope Cottage has just announced with HHM Health to provide healthcare to low-income pregnant women at Hope Cottage. Stephanie talked about the work that Hope Cottage does to facilitate adoptions whether thru one on one private or public adoptions or adoption thru the foster care system. We talked about the history of Hope Cottage and how the needs of women have changed and the services they provide to mothers to be including parenting classes and financial literacy classes. Whatever a woman decides Hope Cottage can be there for them in their journey. Brian Hawkins talked about HHM Health and the work that they do to provide healthcare to those in underserved communities.
