Neighbors say a squatter was living at the home, and now officials are investigating if he was inside at the time the fire was started. (1:30)

Three people killed, three others critically injured in small plane crash in Lansing. Single-engine aircraft went down just before 9am near Capital Region International Airport. Pilot was attempting to land when something went wrong. Six people were on board, including a pilot, co-pilot, and four passengers. Identities of victims not yet released. NTSB and FAA are investigating. (:30)
