The state caps funding to hundreds of schools to send money the money they deny to other derestricts they feel are in greater need. State Representative Bob Cupp says the current funding formula was created based on the 2008 recession and it's time to recalculate. Cupp says he's already proposed a new plan to governor Mike DeWine to fund schools differently. Districts would be paid based on one dollar amount per student. Multiply that by the district's enrollment. He says no money will be taken away. The state caps funds to more than 160-school districts, 14 in Franklin County. The 2 Franklin County school districts which are guaranteed their money are Grandview Heights and Upper Arlington.
