WKSP provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **3 Governors Controversy:** The death of Georgia governor-elect Eugene Talmadge in late 1946 launched a constitutional crisis that ranks as one of the most unusual political events in U.S. history: the state had three active governors at once, each claiming that he was the true elected official. The first full-length examination of that episode is in the form of a book titled *The Three Governors Controversy: Skullduggery, Machinations, and the Decline of Georgia's Progressive Politics*. Co-author and UGA Professor of Political Science Charles Bullock, discusses this incident and the politics in that era
- **Alzheimer's Music Fest:** The 7th Alzheimer (tm)s Music Fest will be held in Woodstock, Sept. 15. Inspired by families who provide care for loved ones with Alzheimer (tm)s and other dementias and those affected with the diseases, Alzheimer (tm)s Music Fest presents a festival of musicians with diverse musical backgrounds. This year (tm)s headliner is Drivin & Cryin. A number of organizations involved in this year (tm)s event are profiled on this program.
