Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- **Covid-19:** As guidance continues to come in regarding the vaccine and booster shots, health officials are setting up new sites to get vaccinated while clarifying who is eligible.
- **Environment:** As New Jersey aims to achieve 100-percent clean energy by the year 2050, there is debate on how the state will get there while being economically fair to residents.
- **Health:** A Monmouth County Dad is walking 300-miles to raise funds and awareness for the disease his son has, Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy while a Lacey mother is trying to build support in the U.S. Senate in hopes they'll override the FDA to begin a Phase 4 trial of a treatment drug that can help her son and others battling ALS.
- **Education:** As school gets underway for the 2021-22 academic year, local health and school leaders are working together to ensure students, faculty and staff are safe.
- **Government:** New Jersey is one of only two states in the nation with a Governor's race in 2021 and a former state Assemblyman is trying to reunite the Garden State and upset current Governor Phil Murphy who is looking to become the first Democrat governor in nearly four decades to win re-election in New Jersey.
