WPNA 103.1 FM Programs Addressing Public and Community Issues

During the fourth quarter of 2022, WPNA's bilingual (Polish/English) locally produced programming addressed the following issues of concern to the public:

1. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM* (October 20, 5:00 p.m., segment duration 12:41 min.)
Issue of concern: Visit of the Polish Institute of National Remembrance representatives to Chicago

The story of bear Wojtek, giants of science, or the victorious Wielkopolska Uprising - these stories can be learned by young people as part of performances and workshops organized by the Institute of National Remembrance. Afternoon hosts interviewed Łukasz Witek, director of the History Point at the Institute of National Remembrance and Dr. Adam Pleskaczyński from the Historical Research Office of the Institute of National Remembrance, who invited listeners to the Family Meetings with History at the Polish School at the St. Trinity church on Sunday, October 23.

2. Morning with 103.1 FM (November 1, 8:00 a.m., segment duration 5 min.)

Issue of concern: All Souls Jazz concerts

It is one of the most prestigious events that has been on the cultural map of the Polish community in Chicago for years. Jazz notes will sound at the Chopin Theatre tonight at the All Souls Jazz, or Zadzuski Jazzowe, an all-night meeting with music. There will be two stages with exceptional artists, including: Joachim Mencil, Kaeyra as well as Hanka Nowicka-Rozen and Sylwester Sosniak who visited our studio.

3. Afternoon with 103.1 FM (October 27, 4:00 p.m., segment duration - 6 min.)

Issue of concern: Polish Independence 10K/5K Run/Walk and Polish Independence celebrations abroad

Afternoon hosts discussed the upcoming virtual Polish Independence 10K/5K Run/Walk, commemorating the 105 anniversary of Poland regaining independence, and the ways the station listeners can participate in the event. Other commemorative events and their programs were discussed with information on how to participate.

4. Morning with 103.1 FM (November 7, 8:00 a.m., segment duration - 4 min.)

Issue of concern: Polish Film Festival in America

Morning show hosts, Mateusz Pankiewicz and Wiktoria Kitner, discussed the upcoming Polish Film Festival in America, the annual showcase of Polish film outside of Poland, to be held in November. The festival program highlights were summarized for the listeners.

5. Saturdays with 103.1 FM (November 26, 9:00 a.m., segment duration - 4 min.)

Issue of concern: Holocaust Exhibit

Renata Przemyk, Darek "Maleo" Malejonek and Marek Różycki from the Society of Educational Projects talked about the Chicago edition of the exhibition and the concert "As if we never existed" as part of the Day of Remembrance of the Holocaust on the 80th anniversary of Operation Reinhardt.

6. Afternoon with 103.1 FM (December 23, 5:00 p.m., segment duration - 5 min.)

Issue of concern: Ten ways to give back

Afternoon hosts discussed the ways listeners can donate to those in need in the holiday season, listing a number of places that can safely accept donations.
