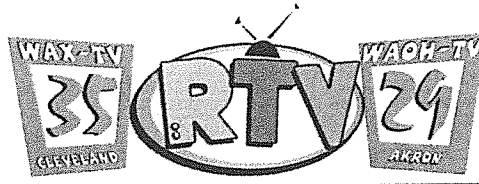

Community Issues List

1. Education

Local school funding problems. School levy issues. Children are expected to buy more school supplies than in the past. 4. Economy and Employment

Rising cost of energy prices. Large loss of jobs throughout the listening area. Negative local Impact of job outsourcing and automation. Unemployment throughout the country.

5. Environment

Run down houses in local neighborhoods and the money that the city spends to keep them from becoming hazards. Praise and complaints regarding the upkeep and maintenance of local roads. Parking problems in local neighborhoods. People parking illegally near schools and practice fields. Complaints against animal shelters. Problems cause by business and residential neighborhoods being vacated and allowed to deteriorate.

6. Substance Abuse
