ARTS & CULTURE

INFORME ESPECIAL Sunday January 2, 2022 7:00am Half-hour
Ulises Espinosa – Host of Informe Especial – talks about the importance of Christmas and Three Kings Day holidays in Puerto Rico’s culture. Provides information about events and activities in the western area of the island during the holidays, and played for the listening audience typical Puerto Rican music relative to Three Kings Day.

AGRICULTURE

INFORME ESPECIAL Sunday January 9, 2022 7:00am Half-hour
Eric Pietri Pietri – Agronomist and Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) from SEA (Acronym for: Servicios de Extensión Agrícola) University of Puerto Rico, Mayagüez Campus – talks about “Mangosteen”, (*Garcinia mangostana*), also known as the purple mangosteen, is a tropical evergreen tree with edible fruit native to tropical lands. It is a rich source of vitamin C. Mangosteen is commonly known as the "Queen of Fruits", and is similar to the quenepa. It is transplanted at 4 years old, grows approximately 30 to 60 feet tall and has 66 milligrams of vitamin C. If it is sown by seed, the tree takes 25 years to reproduce and if it is grafted, it takes between 6 or 8 years to reproduce.

INFORME ESPECIAL Sunday February 20, 2022 7:00am Half-hour
Eric Pietri Pietri – Agronomist and Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) from SEA (Acronym for: Servicios de Extensión Agrícola) University of Puerto Rico, Mayagüez Campus – talks about “Noni”, (*Morinda citrifolia*) is a fruit-bearing tree in the coffee family. Its native range extends across India, Malaysia and Australasia. Brought to the island by the colonizers to Boquerón, the tree can grow from 10 to 30 feet tall. There are benefits to Noni since it is medicinal, it is effective against respiratory, digestive, nervous diseases, allergies, arthritis, diabetes, tuberculosis, cancer, influenza, viral infections, and strengthens the immune system. There are some 100 names for the fruit across different regions, the more common English names of great morinda, Indian mulberry, beach mulberry, and cheese fruit. There are over 80 species of Noni, when the fruit is ripe you can mix it with grape juice or cranberry.

Eric Pietri Pietri – Agronomist and Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) from SEA (Acronym for: Servicios de Extensión Agrícola) University of Puerto Rico, Mayagüez Campus – talks about “Guamá”, (*Inga Laurina*) and its different varieties. It is found from Mexico south to Argentina, the mature tree can produce between 40 to 200 vainas (pods) per year, the tree can last up to 25 years. The

pods look like bay leaves and the seed can be roasted, eaten and has an almond flavor.

Dr. Sheila Justiniano – Clinical Psychologist – talks about Self-esteem, the term self-esteem is used to describe a person's overall subjective sense of personal worth or value - in other words, how much you appreciate and like yourself. Self-esteem encompasses beliefs about oneself as well as emotional states, such as triumph, despair, pride, and shame. A low self-esteem can reduce the quality of a person's life in many ways. Sheila says that you can tell a person has low self-esteem when they have constant self-criticism, negative self-perception, lack of confidence, emotional dependency and others. Ways to improve your self-esteem and having healthy relationships:

Learn to value and love yourself, recognize problem areas, and have more quality time.

Write down all your positive things.

Think about what you think of yourself, look at the positive not the negative, look at your strengths whether it is your physical strength or others.

Dr. José Ferrer López –Director Continuing Education and Professional Studies (DECEP) and Educación a Distancia (On-line courses), Recinto Universitario de Mayagüez (RUM) – DECEP provides working adults and people that have had their college studies interrupted, another way to finish their University Studies. Dr. Ferrer talks about continuing education, the availability of on line and face-to-face classes. Classes are available night, day and weekends. DECEP has the task and great commitment to facilitate continuous learning for the entire Puerto Rican population and outside of our island (diaspora). Edwin talks about Coronavirus and dental health, and the problems that patients have faced in their mouth for fear of the pandemic (not going to their dentists).
