Poinsettias are the most popular of the holiday plants.

Poinsettias are native to southern Mexico and Central America. Poinsettias also bloom in cream, lemon, peach, pink colors and with white and gold-splashed leaves. Poinsettia's botanical name, *Euphorbia pulcherrima*, means "the most beautiful Euphorbia". Poinsettia was named after the former US ambassador to Mexico, Dr. Joel R. Poinsett who introduced the Poinsettia to the United States. Recent research has proved that Poinsettias are not poisonous. It is used in most Christmas decorations, owing to its bright red color and its blooming season coinciding with the Christmas holiday season.
