Abigail Acevedo Mercado – provides information to the community on special topics – today Abigail talks about Kidney Failure and Dialysis - Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD), also known as chronic renal disease, is progressive loss in kidney function over a period of months or years. Since December 2015, there have been over 6,000 cases of kidney disease, and 21 minors are connected to a dialysis machine for at least 12 hours weekly. In medicine, dialysis is a process for removing waste and excess water from the blood and is used primarily as an artificial replacement for lost kidney function in people with kidney failure. In the US, there are 1,200 young persons annually that develop renal problems due to bad eating habits.
