The record-breaking flights, the aerial exhibitions and races, the interviews to support her favorite causes, the endless speeches and promotional commitments, together with household responsibilities, health problems, and financial worries, combined to push Earhart to the point of exhaustion. In 1937, she set out to accomplish yet another first: to circle the earth along the equator on an east-west flight. Friends warned that her preparations were hurried, even careless. When her plane disappeared without a trace, the "First Lady of the Air" was instantly transformed into an American legend.

From Guam, the Nimitz sails through the Straits of Malacca, past Singapore to Kuala Lumpur, the last liberty call before the long haul to the Persian Gulf.

History of Hispanics in Baseball

Baseball is considered the national pastime of the United States. For Hispanics, baseball can represent generations of tradition, playing and loving the game. In some countries strong in the baseball tradition like Venezuela and the Dominican Republic, young boys aspire to be great baseball players, it is what they live for.

Not many are aware that the first Latino in professional baseball was Esteban Enrique Bellan, who played for the Troy Haymakers in 1871. Bellan was from Cuba, born in 1950, and played professional ball for three years. Thirty one years after that, Colombian second baseman Luis Castro plays for Philadelphia in 1902.

In the earlier times of baseball a few white Latinos were able to break into the majors, while black Latinos were not. That is until Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier in 1947, which opened the door for many. The first black Latino to enter the realm of major league baseball was Orestes better known as Minnie Minoso in 1949 playing for Cleveland.

The decades following, Latino players were being recognized as some of the greats of baseball. Luis Aparicio, Venezuelan Rookie of the year 1956 playing with the Chicago White Sox is considered the stolen base king. Other notable Hispanic players are those inducted into the Major League Hall of Fame. The first Hispanic to take his place in the hall of fame was Roberto Clemente.

Roberto, a Puerto Rican, was inducted in 1973 and the Pittsburg Pirates retired his uniform. The 70's through the 90's brought us players like Rod Carew, Fernando Venezuela, Jose Canseco, Kieth Hernandez, Sammy Sosa and Ivan or Pudge Rodriguez. These are just a few of the many individual Hispanics that have contributed to the history of Major League baseball.

From the early beginnings to today, Hispanics have and continue to contribute greatly to the legacy of the great sport of baseball.

There are ball players in the farm systems ready and eager to make their mark. Mid-Michigan has their own minor league team, the Great Lakes Loons, with their home field being in Midland.

Approximately 35 percent of the Great Lakes Loons are Hispanic. This team is the farm team for the Los Angeles Dodgers. Loons manager, Juan Bustabad shares his thoughts on why he feels there is such a Hispanic presence in baseball.
