The president also is subjected to a storm of criticism for expanding the Grand Teton National Park in Wyoming by accepting a gift of land secretly purchased by John D. Rockefeller Jr.

The King understood that saving the art would save the people, because without cultural identity there is nothing. Paul struck out on his own, planting churches in his image around the Mediterranean and writing letters that would become central to all later Christian theology. Finally, in 70 AD, disaster struck the headquarters of the Jesus followers. After decades of rising tension, Judea erupted in revolt against Rome. War had been raging for four years. And when Rome finally established control, it destroyed much of Jerusalem; it torched the sacred Temple and enslaved the population. The scorched ground of Judea could no longer nurture a Jewish Jesus movement. And in the end, it was Paul's communities that would grow and change into the churches we know today.

Rome had little tolerance for those it judged disruptive of the Pax Romana (Roman peace), punishing them in many ways, including crucifixion. The death of Jesus was a Roman act; there was little if any notice taken by Jewish people. Jesus was another victim of the Pax Romana.

Every seventy seconds someone in America develops Alzheimer's disease, and by the mid-century, some will get Alzheimer's every thirty-three seconds.

There are many new medications that can, in many cases, slow the onset of Alzheimer's in some people.

Experts in the field also say that diet, exercise and reading can help prevent it.

The lifetime cost of caring for someone with Alzheimer's is roughly one hundred seventy-four thousand dollars.

The longer you can keep your loved one in their home or your home, as opposed to an assisted living facility, the greater the savings. Earlier diagnosis and better treatments are also making a big difference in that area.

One in ten people over the age of sixty-five have Alzheimer's and nearly half over the age of eighty-five have it. Inherited forms of the disease can strike people as early as their thirties and forty's.

Career Retooling

Michigan has the highest unemployment rate in the country. Many of those out of work people are over fifty, who were downsized by an employer they may have worked for, for many years. The prospects of these employees going back to the same job anytime soon are probably not very good. A person's economic survival may depend on their willingness to reinvent themselves, by learning new skills that can lead to a successful career, but in a different field.

Michigan Governor Jennifer Granholm chose Delta College as the backdrop for a key economic message. Her message, yes Michigan's economic situation is bleak and yes a lot of people are out of work. The good news she says, you don't have to leave the state or the area to find the resources and tools you need to find work. However you may need to consider a career retooling to find a new job in a different field that you are use to. Delta College has a sixteen week program called "Fast Start" which prepares people for careers in the growing chemical processing related field. Getting started in "Fast Start" can be a daunting task for many people trying to get retrained into a new career, especially for those over fifty who found themselves out of work for the first time in their lives. "Fast start" is the product of a partnership involving Delta College, Dow Corning, Dow Chemical, Hemlock Semiconductor, Evergreen Solar and the Great Lakes Bay Region of Michigan Works. The "Fast Start" program is not first come, first serve. They are looking for students with the right background and the right mindset.

Training people for positions in the chemical processing related field is just one of many careers that Delta College is training people in connection with Delta College Corporate Services. Another area that's hitting home with the over fifty crowd is the "Fast Track" program which gives people the game plan to run their own business. The eight week program is part of the Michigan Small Business and Technology Development Center that is located at Delta College.

Whether it's starting your own business or working towards a new career in the chemical processing field, the folks in the over fifty crowd say it's empowering to go in a different direction career wise and have success. They would encourage others not to be afraid to step out of their comfort zone and try something new. The "Fast Start" program which trains people for careers in the chemical processing field has been around since October of 2008 and they have taken more than sixty students through the program. The "Fast Track" program which is housed at Delta College through the Michigan Small Business and Technology Center got its start seven years ago. They have helped hundreds of people start their own business.

On June 11, 2009, the [World Health Organization](http://www.who.int) (WHO) signaled that a pandemic of 2009 H1N1 flu was underway.

Dr. Constan believes that many people are afraid to get the swine flu vaccine because they mistrust the government and question the vaccines safety. He says there is no reason to be afraid, and he encourages most everyone to get the vaccine if they can, to protect themselves and those they come in contact with.
