Welcome to the world of killer tomatoes and murderous potatoes! Even the more well-known carnivorous plants - sundews, flytraps and pitchers - are revealing new behaviour. Carnivorous plants have featured in many sci-fi films over the years, but the reality turns out to be far stranger than the fiction.
