John Brown Pike: Our contributor bought a spear, or pike, from an antique shop in Chagrin Falls, Ohio. He knows abolitionist John Brown lived near Chagrin Falls and wonders if rebels used this blade in John Brown's famous raid at Harpers Ferry, VA. In October 16, 1859, John Brown and 18 men attacked the federal armory in Harpers Ferry. Brown wanted to secure weapons for a future slave rebellion. Instead, thirteen raiders were killed; John Brown was captured and hanged. To find out whether rebels used this pike in that raid, History Detectives follows the trail to the blacksmith who forged the weapon over 150 years ago, and walks the ground at Harpers Ferry where the battle took place. **Siberian Bullet:** Rummaging through a box of shells and bullets at a Colorado gun show, a History Detectives fan discovered a World War I vintage cartridge with a curious etching: Leo V. Thompson, CO E 31st Inf., A.E.F. Siberia. The wording makes him wonder if American troops were in Siberia, Russia during WWI. Inside the casing we find a small blade that looks like a letter opener. Nearly 40 years after he paid one dollar for the bullet, our contributor still wonders about Leo V. Thompson. **Ronald McDonald Costume:** Have we found the original costume that launched Ronald McDonald? The label credits a well-known costume designer, and the costume looks similar to the suit we see in an early Ronald McDonald commercial: the yellow balloon coverall, red and white striped shirt and long stockings, and red oversized shoes. But there are also some curious differences. History Detectives consults with a food and social historian, meets McDonald's first Chief Marketing Officer, and finally speaks with the widow of one of the first Ronald McDonald clowns.

African American Comic Book: Our contributor found an unusual 1950's comic book at an auction, titled Negro Romance. This was the Golden Age of comic books, when Americans voraciously consumed stories about superheroes, determined detectives and thrilling romances--yet very few featured African American characters. Did black artists create this comic book? And who was the intended audience? **Lindbergh-Sikorsky Fabric:** For over 50 years our contributor has cherished an object he inherited from his late father. It's a piece of fabric in Plexiglas with signatures of Charles Lindbergh and Igor Sikorsky and dated August 1943. His father said the fabric came from the Spirit of St. Louis, the airplane Lindbergh flew non-stop from New York to Paris in 1927. But why would helicopter inventor Igor Sikorsky sign this fabric? Since his father died when he was just a teen, our contributor didn't have a chance to ask more about this souvenir. **Civil War Letters:** A couple of stamp enthusiasts found far more than stamps in a box they purchased. In the box, along with Civil War era stamps, we find letters addressed to a William Blackford, Senate Post, Washington, D.C. One letter appears to be from his brother, John Blackford. In the letter John asks for help securing an officer position in an African American unit. A second letter informs William Blackford that his brother, John, has been wounded. Why would John Blackford want to command an African American unit? Did he survive his wounds and did he ever receive the commission?

Elia Kazan's name was brought front and center to the world again during the buzz surrounding the March 1999 Academy Awards. He was to receive an Oscar for Lifetime Achievement, an honor that divided Hollywood. Then 89 years old, Kazan was primarily remembered for his impressive directorial body of work in the 1950s - On the Waterfront, East of Eden, A Streetcar Named Desire, Gentleman's Agreement, A Face in the Crowd -

John Brown Pike: Our contributor bought a spear, or pike, from an antique shop in Chagrin Falls, Ohio. He knows abolitionist John Brown lived near Chagrin Falls and wonders if rebels used this blade in John Brown's famous raid at Harpers Ferry, VA. In October 16, 1859, John Brown and 18 men attacked the federal armory in Harpers Ferry. Brown wanted to secure weapons for a future slave rebellion. Instead, thirteen raiders were killed; John Brown was captured and hanged. To find out whether rebels used this pike in that raid, History Detectives follows the trail to the blacksmith who forged the weapon over 150 years ago, and walks the ground at Harpers Ferry where the battle took place.

Siberian Bullet: Rummaging through a box of shells and bullets at a Colorado gun show, a History Detectives fan discovered a World War I vintage cartridge with a curious etching: Leo V. Thompson, CO E 31st Inf., A.E.F. Siberia. The wording makes him wonder if American troops were in Siberia, Russia during WWI. Inside the casing we find a small blade that looks like a letter opener. Nearly 40 years after he paid one dollar for the bullet, our contributor still wonders about Leo V. Thompson.

Ronald McDonald Costume: Have we found the original costume that launched Ronald McDonald? The label credits a well-known costume designer, and the costume looks similar to the suit we see in an early Ronald McDonald commercial: the yellow balloon coverall, red and white striped shirt and long stockings, and red oversized shoes. History Detectives consults with a food and social historian, meets McDonald's first Chief Marketing Officer, and finally speaks with the widow of one of the first Ronald McDonald clowns.

Elia Kazan's name was brought front and center to the world again during the buzz surrounding the March 1999 Academy Awards. Assange's stated mission has been to force the U.S. and other governments into maximum transparency through his whistle-blowing website. Through in-depth interviews with Manning's father, Assange, and others close to the case, veteran FRONTLINE correspondent Martin Smith tells the full story behind the leaks. Why would four innocent men confess to a brutal crime they didn't commit? Nearly 40 years after he paid one dollar for the bullet, our contributor still wonders about Leo V. Strokes

A stroke is an interruption of the blood supply to any part of the brain. It is sometimes called a "brain attack". If blood flow is stopped for longer than a few seconds, the brain cannot get blood and oxygen. Brain cells can die, causing permanent damage. There are two major types of stroke: ischemic stroke and hemorrhagic stroke. Ischemic stroke occurs when a blood vessel that supplies blood to the brain is blocked by a blood clot. Hemorrhagic stroke occurs when a blood vessel in part of the brain becomes weak and bursts open, causing blood to leak into the brain.

There are many risk factors for stroke. High blood pressure is the number one risk factor. Other risk factors include Atrial fibrillation, diabetes, family history of stroke, heart disease, high cholesterol, and increasing age. Risks for bleeding into the brain include alcohol use, bleeding disorders, cocaine use and head injury.

The symptoms of stroke depend on what part of the brain is damaged. In some cases, a person may not even be aware that they have had a stroke. Symptoms usually develop suddenly and without warning. Symptoms include headache, change in alertness, changes in hearing, changes in taste, clumsiness, confusion, difficulty swallowing, loss of balance to name a few.

A quick reference to know if someone is having a stroke is to remember these three words: smile, reach, speech. Smile: During a stroke, one side of the face may not move as well as the other. Ask the person to smile. If the smile is crooked or one side of the face droops, it may indicate a stroke. Reach: During a stroke, one side of the body may be weak or unable to move at all. Ask the person to hold both arms straight out for 10 seconds. If one arm drifts down or cannot be raised at all, it may indicate a stroke. Speech: During a stroke, mental confusion or slurred speech is common. Ask the person to repeat a familiar phrase. If words are slurred or mixed up, it may indicate a stroke.

A stroke is a medical emergency. Call 911 or your local emergency number at the first sign of a stroke. It is important for people who are having stroke symptoms to get to a hospital as quickly as possible. **DO NOT DRIVE YOURSELF. CALL 911 AND HAVE AN AMBULANCE TAKE YOU.** If the stroke is caused by a blood clot, a clot busting drug may be given to dissolve the clot. Most of the time, patients must reach a hospital within 3 hours after symptoms begin. Treatment depends on the severity and cause of the stroke.

Brain Fitness

Diet and exercise are not only important for our bodies, but it is also important for our brains. Positive brain activity can ward off certain diseases among other things. Some of the activities that the 50 plus crowd are doing to stimulate their brains are exercise, furthering their education by taking classes, reading, card playing and other social activities that involving thinking and communication. The one thing you don't want to do is isolate yourself from the rest of the world.

911

If you are having a stroke or some other kind of health emergency, you need to call 911. But there is much more you need to know about 911 than making a call. Most 911 dispatches handle all medical, fire and police calls.

When calling for a medical emergency, you will be asked certain questions that will allow the ambulance and fire department to know how bad the emergency is and what kind of equipment they need to bring. Some questions they will ask include your address, your cross street and your phone number, which will help the medical team know if they are going to the correct location. Then they will ask a series of questions about the patient including, how old are they, are they conscious, are they breathing. If you are calling because of a stroke, they will ask more specific questions like are they having trouble speaking, are they having trouble breathing, are they having trouble moving.

There are some things you can do while you wait for the ambulance to arrive include turning on the porch light, put any pets away and put out any medications the patient is taking. When the ambulance arrives, paramedics will ask the same questions that the 911 dispatcher asked to make sure they know how to proceed in treatment. Cell phones have created an issue for emergency responders. If you call from a land line, the 911 dispatcher has your exact address. If you are using a cell phone, the 911 dispatcher will receive a latitude and longitude closest to your location. Because of this they will ask for an exact address. If you are unable to give one, emergency responders will knock on each door until they find you. Response time depends on geographic location, time of day and busyness of emergency response teams.

911 are funded many different ways, either by a millage or by surcharge. It all depends on the county that you live in.

If you live in an area that has sirens, there are a few things you need to know. If your county has a designated phone number, be sure to call. Turn on your local news for details. Have a battery powered radio in case of emergency. Each community is different, so find out the proper procedures in your town.

Don't be afraid to call. It's better to be safe than sorry, especially during a medical emergency.
