PUBLIC AFFAIRS TOPIC: Anniversary of Women's Right To Vote GUEST: Robbie Melton

Our local Civic and Garden Club is taking special note of the anniversary of the official ratification of the 19th Ammendment to the U.S. Constitution – giving Women the right to vote in elections.

Our guest Robbie Melton detailed how the local organization is having two events to mark the 100th anniversary of the 19th Ammendmenet.

On **Tuesday, August 18** (the exact day of ratification), everyone is being encouraged to "ring a bell" in recognition of 100 years since ratification. The tolling of church bells, people ringing individual bells, etc. are all welcome.

At 7:00 AM on **Saturday**, **August 22**, the local organization will host a "March" to the court house in celebration of 100 years of women's right to vote. The march will form at the historic A.H. Roberts law office building, proceed down University Street, then up Church Street to the town square. Once on the square, the group will march around the court house. Robbie encourages all women to participate, wear white, and join the march anywhere along the route – or – for those needing a shorter distance, park on the square and join the march once it begans marching around the court house.

As with all of our public affairs features, this segment with Robbie Melton is carried in various dayparts over a period of days leading up to the events in order to reach and inform as many citizens as possible.
