On January 2, 2016, long-time Livingston businessman and city alderman Lynn King died suddenly. His death left a vacancy on the six-member Livingston City Board of Aldermen. Much public interest followed his passing creating an issue as to how the remaining members of the board would fill the vacancy.

After several weeks of discussion and consultation with the city's legal advisor it was determined that the board would wait until after the June 1, 2016 to fill King's seat. Livingston city voters will elect three aldermen in normal election cycle process at that time.

Since a total of six individuals filed to run for the three seats to be elected this June, the board decided that from those other unsuccessful three candidates the current sitting board will choose the person who will serve out the remaining two years of King's term.

WLIV AM & FM have been diligent to keep the public informed of developments as to when and how the vacancy on the board of aldermen will be filled.

Through on-going coverage, the public has been made aware of the issues created by the sudden, unexpected passing of a city alderman and what will be done to fill the vacant seat.
