As Upper Cumberland Habitat For Humanity expands its service area into Overton County, the need for additional volunteers is an on-going concern. Trent Carter, local office representative for Upper Cumberland Habitat For Humanity – which is the new name after Putnam County Habitat For Humanity merged with Overton County Habitat – was featured on our public affairs programming.

Mr. Carter outlined the various areas in which volunteers can work to benefit Habitat. Mr. Carter also described what a Habitat home is and how people qualify to move into one. Carter pointed out that residents work to pay back the home through various methods.

Upper Cumberland Habitat For Humanity also operates their "Restore" which sells donated building supplies, furniture, and other goods to help raise funds for their projects.

The organization recently held their first blessing of a building site in Overton county which signals they are nearing the time when construction will start of the first Habitat home to every be built in this county.

Mr. Carter's interview was featured multiple times on FOCUS ON COMMUNITY, a public affairs program heard regularly on both WLIV AM and WLIV FM.
