Cordell Hull State Park, named in honor of Upper Cumberland native and former Secretary of State under President Franklin D. Roosevelt, offers much to local residents and out-of-the-area visitors alike.

The park, conveniently located near Byrdstown and the Dale Hollow Lake recreational area, is a living history center which houses the Hull collection of personal artifacts from his years in government service. Among the treasures kept at the park is the Nobel Peace Prize medallion that Mr. Hull received for his vital role in helping to establish the United Nations.

The visitor center also serves as a mini museum and displays many articles from Secretary Hulls time in the service of American. Visitors can wander freely and see, among other things, gifts given to Mr. Hull by foreign heads of state such as British Prime Minister Winston Churchill's gift to Mr. Hull. Time spent in the visitor center is just stop number one on a trip to the grounds.

A short walk away is the log cabin in which Mr. Hull was born, furnished with true to the period items.

The park grounds also hosts events throughout the summer and fall months to educate and inform visitors.

Our guest on "Focus On The Community" was Jordan Fraley. Mr. Fraley, a park official, told listeners about what special activities are on the current calendar at Cordell Hull Park.
