From Oct 1 – December 31, 2020:

- WLS-TV aired 18 regularly scheduled local programs dealing with community issues this year, **731** public service announcements this quarter, and a number of special programs.
- In addition, we aired a variety of programming on our Localish Network on 7.2 – a single 24/7 over-the-air digital multicast platform. Localish Network features programs that tell stories about people engaging in and changing their communities for the better showcasing the good in society and connecting people across the country. These programs focus on a variety of topics which includes, good people, good food, and good places to visit and more as well as an hour of E/I programming which is not shown on (your D1 channel). The Localish Network Channel also aired **1,056** public service announcements.

Windy City Live a one-hour daily program showcasing anything and everything Chicago and also offering local news and weather reports, airs Monday-Friday on 7.1, and is rebroadcast daily on 7.2.

WLS-TV also broadcasts over 41 hours of local news programs per week.

The ABC Television Network also supplies the station with news, public interest and educational programming, as described in the quarterly report entitled **ABC TELEVISION NETWORK NEWS and PUBLIC AFFAIRS PROGRAMMING** which is filed separately in the public inspection file.

 - Holy Name Cathedral provides its weekly Sunday Mass services for its parish and others seeking the teachings of the Catholic faith on the 7.1 channel. This is a paid program.

- **Ñ Beat** *Aired: 11p-11:30p on 10/4 with a repeat on 10/18 at 4:30p-5p*
 - The Ñ Beat explores the devastating impact COVID-19 has on Chicago's Latinx community.
- **African American Short Films** *Aired: 2:30p-3:30p on 10/18*
 - African American Films - showcases short films made by African Americans that range from comedy to drama, and all the shades in between. These filmmakers capture the images and are the voices of contemporary life in the African American community, expressing themselves through Animation, Docudrama, Film Noir, Bios, stylized Portraits and scripted pieces.
- **Names, Not Numbers** *Aired: 3a-4a on 10/24 (Net Religious)*
 - This compelling and timely film follows the life-changing experience of a group of Miami students, participants in a one-of-a-kind interactive oral history film project, who interviewed Holocaust survivors and documented their memories, stories, and lessons learned. "Names, Not Numbers" takes you along these students' journey as they forged lasting relationships with the survivors, who shared their personal stories and reflections for a better tomorrow.

 - Docuseries and 60 minute special. We had a week of inserts in our 4p News (docuseries).
- **Kamala: To Be The First** *Aired: 11:30p-12a on 12/6*
 - The life and career of Kamala Harris soon to be the first Black Asian female US VP told through friends, colleagues, mentors, and the young people she inspired.
- **Our Chicago: Living While Black** *Aired: 11:30p-12a on 12/13*
 - The half-hour special features two storylines, the first, an intimate portrait of one South Shore family who opens up about "life in their neighborhood", the violence that surrounds them and how they beat the odds. The second, an eye-opening look at Black women's maternal health and maternity deserts on the South Side as expectant mothers, new mothers, and OBGYN doctors give accounts of the obstacles they face.
