Brief Overview of how it was addressed: In a discussion based on their book 9 Lies That Will Destroy Your Marriage, Drs. Greg Smalley and Bob Paul describe how cultural myths and fairy-tale expectation about marriage have a detrimental effect on couples, and how knowing and applying biblical truth can help those couples develop a thriving marriage.
