The study involves trapping the animals and then finding out details such as confirm the sex, checking on body condition, and taking DNA samples. So far, the group has captured and released 53 different bobcats on 63 occasions and the collared bobcats have been spotted at nearly 50K locations.

Hundreds of volunteers turned up and greatly exceeded that goal. After removing the refuse, they spread wildflower seeds. A strong sense of community and love for the river was in abundance.

He was born in Nogales, AZ to a father who was a Buffalo Soldier stationed at Camp Little in 1922. He later became known as a virtuoso jazz bass player, band leader, and composer. Although Mingus' time in Nogales was brief, his Southern Arizona roots are still a sense of pride and celebration for the community. His 100 th birthday was celebrated with concerts in Phoenix, Tucson, and Nogales by the quintet Mingus Dynasty before being finalized with the unveiling of the Charles Mingus Memorial in Nogales.

New Frontiers	SPACEWATCH	03/19/2024 at 6.30pm	00:28:00	SPACEWATCH is a NASA-funded program at the University of Arizona's Lunar and Planetary Lab that was founded in 1980 to keep track of hazardous asteroids and comets in our solar system that might pose an impact threat to Earth. The program, led by Principal Investigator Melissa Brucker, makes observations 24+ nights a month from Kitt Peak National Observatory in Arizona. Their most recent headline-grabbing collaboration was with the NASA DART mission, which smacked a small spacecraft into an asteroid to see how well it could deflect the rock from its orbital trajectory, as a test for planetary defense.
14. Arizona Illustrated	Ellen and Laci – Bulldog therapy	03/24/2024	00:28:00	"She failed at agility and she failed at obedience, but she's a great therapy dog." That's the statement from Ellen Morell, a former dental hygienist, planned giving consultant and current ordained Episcopal priest who now works at Harmony Hospice in Tucson. Eight years ago, Morell obtained a bulldog puppy named Laci and they've become great friends.
