Education	Morning Show Interview	16-Jun	8:15 AM	20 minutes	Western Illinois University President Jack Thomas addressed the media to discuss the Strategic Plan Supplement and the Presidents Executive Institute. The two programs work hand in hand to help WIU move forward despite the financial hardships occurring due to the state's budget impasse. Western Illinois University had it's state appropriated funding cut by 20% in 2014-15 and recieved less than 50% of its appropriated funding for the 2016-17 school year. The Strategic Plan Supplement and the Presidents Executive Institute focus on 3 goals. Stabalizing enrollment at 10,000 total students through engaging in university-wide and discipline-specific recruitment and retention activities, expanding high school, community, and institutional relationships, and utilizing military relationship. The second goal is enhancing educational opportunites through the development of new programs and the expansion of off campus and online programs. Lastly WIU will seek to improve community relationships through the expansion of local internship opportunites, and increasing revenue through grants and contracts as well as increase fundraising efforts. The 2017-18 supplement plan passed unanimously. President Thomas reiterated that the University will not let the budget impasse define who they are and that the WIU will continue to move forward.
