

Warner, Outreach Coordinator, announces that free nicotine replacement therapy is available to smokers who do not have health insurance through the agency's tobacco Quitline at 1-800-QUIT-NOW. She says many people without health insurance delay using effective aids like nicotine gum or patches to help them quit smoking because they worry about the costs. To overcome this barrier and increase the likelihood of a successful quit attempt, DHEC helps the uninsured access nicotine replacement therapies at no cost to them through their tobacco Quitline.
